**A. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL**

Motion to approve the Minutes of the November 16, 2017, meeting – December 21, 2017 meeting cancelled.

**C. FOLLOW-UP ITEMS**

**1. Req. #2015-188: Gold Line – Mayflower and Central Aves**

**2. Mayflower Ave and Huntington Dr**

Preliminary plans were discussed at the December 17, 2015, meeting. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines. Committee to review signal timing. **DO NOT BLOCK INTERSECTION** signage installed for north and southbound traffic.

**2. Req. #2016-026: North and South Mayflower Ave (from Huntington Dr) – Safety**

Resident requesting to refresh street striping on north and south Mayflower from Huntington and/or to add raised pavement markers. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines. **DO NOT BLOCK INTERSECTION** signage installed for north and southbound traffic. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2015-188 and Req. #2017-054).*

**3. Req. #2016-065: California and Lemon Aves – Safety (signage)**

Resident requesting a four-way Stop controlled intersection on California at Lemon. Current two-way Stop controlled intersection on Lemon (east / west traffic). The Police Department records indicate that seven collisions have occurred as of January 2016. Of the seven collisions, six were non-injury and one was a hit and run investigation. There were two Police Reports taken of the seven incidents. Cross Traffic Does Not Stop (east / west traffic) signage installed, 25 linear feet of red curbing installed on the east side of California north and south of Lemon, along with the refreshing the intersection striping. Brush clearance completed on the southwest corner. Letters mailed on Wednesday, August 16, and Tuesday, November 7, 2017, providing the resident with a traffic calming update along with an ongoing evaluation period.

4. **Req. #2017-008: Parkrose Ave at Bradoaks Elementary School – Traffic**  
Resident requesting additional Police patrol to monitor traffic violators; NO U-TURN and parking in stripped red curb zone during school drop-off and pick-up hours. Location is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. New signage installed on Thursday, November 16, 2017; seven regarding parking, two Stop, and one
5. **Req. #2017-014: Mountain Ave (north of Lemon) – Traffic / Safety / NO PARKING (red curb)**  
Resident requesting red curbing on the east side of Mountain, north of Lemon, prior to the northbound traffic lanes merging to the left. Letters delivered to the residents of the 400 block of Mountain on Monday, November 6, 2017, with a 30-day evaluation period of potential 90' of NO PARKING and red curbing, on the east side. Temporary NO PARKING signage posted on Tuesday, November 7, 2017. Ninety feet of red curbing installed on the east side on Mountain on Monday, December 11, 2017. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014, Req. #2016-044, and Req. #2016-47 – Closed.*
6. **Req. #2017-015: 714 North Norumbega Dr – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**  
Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions on N Norumbega due to speeding. The Police Department conducted a data trailer speed study on Tuesday, November 28 through Tuesday, December 5, 2017. The statistics indicate that 1,218 vehicles were tracked. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile of speed driven is 23 mph with the overall average speed of 19.4 mph driven. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Based upon the statistics gathered, the flow of traffic is consistent with the posted speed limit. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the data trailer statistics.
7. **Req. #2017-016: Mayflower and Evergreen / Diamond intersection – Safety (crosswalks and sidewalks)**  
Resident requesting 4-way crosswalks and wrap-around sidewalks; currently blocked by an Edison power pole, and to allow for pedestrian traffic. Staff to conduct an on-site visit and evaluation with the City Engineer. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2017-032.*
8. **Req. #2017-026: Alta Vista and Chestnut Aves – Safety (signage)**  
Resident requesting a 4-way Stop controlled intersection; currently a 2-way (east / west) intersection. The Police Department records indicate that six collisions have occurred as of June 2016. Of the six collisions, four were non-injury and two were injury. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2017-035.*
9. **Req. #2017-028: 700 – 800 blocks of Wildrose, Oakdale, and Lime Aves – NO PARKING**  
Resident requesting enforcement of NO PARKING on the 700 – 800 blocks of Wildrose, Oakdale, and Lime. Staff to conduct an on-site evaluation of current signage to determine if hours need to be adjusted.
10. **Req. #2017-029: 329 Linwood Ave alleyway – NO PARKING (signage)**  
Resident requesting NO PARKING signage in the alleyway where his garage is located. Vehicles are parked in the alleyway and block his garage.
11. **Req. #2017-032: Mayflower and Evergreen / Diamond intersection – Safety**  
Resident requesting a signal intersection due to traffic violators not adhering to the current 4-way Stop controlled intersection. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2017-016.*

**12. Req. #2017-035: Alta Vista and Chestnut Aves – Safety (signage)**

Business owner requesting a 4-way Stop controlled intersection; currently a 2-way (east / west) intersection. The Police Department records indicate that six collisions have occurred as of June 2016. Of the six collisions, four were non-injury and two were injury. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2017-026.*

**13. Req. #2017-037: Magnolia and Palm Aves – Safety (signage)**

Resident requesting a 4-way Stop controlled intersection at Magnolia and Palm; currently a 2-way (east / west) intersection. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc.

**14. Req. #2017-039: Mayflower and Olive Aves (Monroe Elementary) – Traffic / Safety**

1. Resident requesting a 4-way Stop controlled intersection at Mayflower and Olive; currently 2-way (east / west) intersection.
2. Resident requesting blue ADA curb / parking at the Mayflower and Olive intersection, at Monroe Elementary.

**15. Req. #2017-046: 120 El Nido Ave – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study, speed cushions, and enforcement of the NO LEFT TURN from Hillcrest. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic.

**16. Req. #2017-047: 600 block of West Olive Ave (north side) – Speeding / Traffic / Parking**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and the evaluation of limited street parking due to street sweeping and trash pick-up days. The Police Department conducted a data trailer speed study on Wednesday, December 13 through Tuesday, December 19, 2017. The statistics indicate that 2,917 vehicles were tracked. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile of speed driven is 34 mph with the overall average speed of 27.5 mph driven. The posted speed limit is 25 mph.

**17. Req. #2017-048: 311 South California Ave – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions, on California at Palm, due to excessive speeding in a school zone. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic.

**18. Req. #2017-049: 637 West Lemon Ave – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions on Lemon between Violet and Mayflower. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic.

**D. AGENDA ITEMS**

**1. Req. #2017-050: 103 E Altern Ave (at Peck Rd) – Speeding / Traffic / Safety (red curbing)**

Resident requesting a data box speed study due to excessive speeding, on Peck at Altern, and red curbing at the north side of the driveway apron, for line-of-site traffic safety. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic.

**2. Req. #2017-051: 148 E Altern Ave (at Myrtle Ave) – Traffic / Safety (red curbing)**

Resident requesting red curbing, at the northwest corner of Myrtle at Peck, for line-of-site traffic safety.

**3. Req. #2017-052: Parker Ave (at Monroe Elementary School) – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions on Parker, at Monroe Elementary School, due to excessive speeding in a school zone. The Police Department conducted a data trailer speed study on Tuesday, November 21 through Tuesday, November 28, 2017. The statistics indicate that 60,505 vehicles were tracked. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile of speed driven is 38 mph with the overall average speed of 32.5 mph driven. The posted speed limit is 25 mph.

**4. Req. #2017-053: Canyon Blvd (north of Foothill Blvd) – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions on Parker, at Monroe Elementary School, due to excessive speeding in a school zone. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2017-010 – Closed.*

**5. Req. #2017-054: Mayflower Ave and Huntington Dr Walgreens Signage / Myrtle Ave and 210 Fwy Signage / Foothill Blvd and Madison Ave Starbucks – Traffic / Safety**

1. Resident requesting to have the Walgreens sign moved to the north side of the shopping center driveway due to line-of-sight safety on northbound Mayflower.
2. Resident requesting to have DO NOT BLOCK signage added on northbound Mayflower when traffic is backed up at the Huntington intersection.
3. Resident requesting to have the NO RIGHT TURN ON RED signage removed at the Myrtle and 210 Fwy on-ramp.
4. Resident requesting enforcement of the double yellow line restriction at the Starbucks at Foothill and Madison.

*Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-026.*

**6. Req. #2017-055: 330 W Lemon Ave (blue ADA curb) – Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a blue ADA curb / parking for his rental property.

**7. Req. #2018-001: 901 W Hillcrest Blvd (blue ADA curb) – Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a blue ADA curb / parking in front of residence.

**8. Req. #2018-002: 219 W Olive Ave – Speeding / Traffic / Safety**

Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions, on W Olive, due to excessive speeding. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study, provide visual presence, and to monitor the traffic.

**9. Req. #2018-003: Alta Vista Ave and Bella Vista St / Bella Vista St and Estrella St – Traffic / Safety**

Monrovia Renewal Engineers requesting the removal of the center medians at Alta Vista and Bella Vista / Bella Vista and Estrella.
