TITLE: Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for February 2018

OBJECTIVE: To provide an update on incidents, maintenance, and public comments related to Canyon Park and the Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP) recorded for the month of February 2018.

BACKGROUND: For over a century, Canyon Park has been used as a recreational park by visitors and Monrovia residents. Services in Canyon Park include special events; Naturalist led night hikes, interpretive tours, a Nature Center, trails, a waterfall, and views of the San Gabriel Valley. In addition, Naturalists, with the support of many volunteers, maintain the trail system and facilities.

In 2016, the City opened over 4.5 miles of HWP trials providing passive recreational opportunities for the community. Park Naturalists patrol the HWP as well as urban parks two times a day by vehicle, utility terrain vehicle, and foot. Park Naturalists also respond to calls related to Monrovia's No Smoking Ordinance.

The included HWP and Canyon Park Log provide additional information related to the Comments, Maintenance, Incidents, and Events which occurred in February 2018.

ANALYSIS: During the month of February, Park Naturalists completed 113 hours of maintenance throughout the Hillside Wilderness Preserve and 118 hours in Canyon Park. The maintenance included building a bypass trail, repairing erosion culverts, installing water bars to prevent erosion, and brush clearance. From February 12 - 16 Park Naturalists assisted the Monrovia Fire Department giving tours through the Angeles National Monument hiking trails. Programs for this month included first grade education tours for Monroe Elementary School and Bradoaks Elementary School and Kids Craft in the Canyon.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Community Services Commission move to receive and file CC-2, Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for February 2018.
