TITLE: Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for May 2018

OBJECTIVE: To provide an update on incidents, maintenance, and public comments related to Canyon Park and the Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP) recorded for the month of May 2018.

BACKGROUND: For over a century, Canyon Park has been used as a recreational park by visitors and Monrovia residents. Services in Canyon Park include special events; Naturalist led night hikes, interpretive tours, a Nature Center, trails, a waterfall, and views of the San Gabriel Valley. In addition, Naturalists, with the support of many volunteers that maintain the trail system and facilities.

In 2016, the City opened over 4.5 miles of HWP trials providing passive recreational opportunities for the community. Park Naturalists patrol the HWP as well as urban parks two times a day by vehicle, utility terrain vehicle, and foot. Park Naturalists also respond to calls related to Monrovia's No Smoking Ordinance.

The included HWP and Canyon Park Log provide additional information related to the Comments, Maintenance, Incidents, and Events which occurred in May 2018.

ANALYSIS: During the month of May 2018, Park Naturalists completed 102 hours of maintenance throughout the Hillside Wilderness Preserve and 132 hours in Canyon Park. The maintenance included brush clearance along the trails and utility roads, and invasive species removal. Programs for May included the completion of the Kindergarten tours for Monrovia Elementary Schools, and the 2nd and 4th grade programs that were rescheduled due to rainy days earlier in the school year. Kids Craft in the Canyon was held on Saturday, May 27. This month's craft was building a wooden sail boat; there were 11 participants in attendance. Park Naturalist assisted with Fountain to the Falls on Saturday, May 12 and Monrovia Days Thursday, May 17-Sunday May 20.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Community Services Commission move to receive and file CC-2, Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for May 2018.
