

#### Kate Wright, October 1860 – October 1938

Kate and her son, Marshall, lived with a minister and his family in Kentucky and together they moved to Monrovia in 1900. Two years later the minister and his family moved out of state but Kate remained in Monrovia and lived on E. Cypress Avenue. Kate was divinely inspired to devote her life to care for the sick and the poor. Through donations of supplies and labor she built small cottages on her property, where she tended for patients suffering from tuberculosis who had no family or resources to assist them. Kate received no financial compensation for any of her services. She served selflessly for over 30 years and died in 1938. She is buried in Live Oak Cemetery.

#### ACTV Monrovia

The City is currently developing a grant application to explore the possibility of installing a protected bike lane spine connecting Station Square with Old Town Monrovia through an initiative that has been dubbed "ACTV Monrovia." This effort builds on the mobility plans we have been coordinating here in the City during the past few years, from the development of our Bike Master Plan in 2016, to the implementation of our interconnected Class III bike "sharrow" lanes in 2017, to the establishment of our GoMonrovia initiative in 2018.

The ACTV Monrovia program (Active Community Travel Vinculum) involves the possibility of converting both South Primrose Avenue and South Ivy Avenue into one-way streets beginning at Lime Avenue. The plan would allow for the establishment of protected bike lanes without any loss of on-street parking, encourage traffic to slow down in the identified areas, and would also facilitate the "greening" of South Primrose Avenue and South Ivy Avenue, to create a more park-like setting for residents throughout the length of the identified project area.

On Thursday, June 21, a neighborhood meeting was held at James Yuille's home to discuss the changes this would mean to the City. MAP Leaders voices are so important and City Leadership makes sure to meet with affected MAP Leaders

first when things like this come up. On Saturday June 30, there was a block party on Fig to show specifically what the changes would look like. Be on the lookout for more informational meetings on this and on other blocks that will be affected.

#### Monrovia Wildlife Tips and Laws

Bears, Mountain Lions, Coyotes, deer, and other wildlife are protected under the jurisdiction of the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. The City of Monrovia also has certain laws regulating human contact with our wildlife. In short, it is against the law to feed wildlife or to harm wildlife. If you or anyone you know has knowledge that

someone is feeding or harming wildlife, please call the Monrovia Police Department immediately, so we can investigate appropriately. The foothills above Monrovia are occupied by wildlife: bears, coyotes, deer, mountain lions, and bobcats. Sometimes these wild animals venture out of the foothills and into residential neighborhoods and become a potential danger to humans. Police will respond when called to a wildlife sighting, and in most incidents, the primary goal is to allow the animal to leave the area and return back to the foothills. In most incidents, the officer's presence, use of vehicles, horns, beanbag rounds, is sufficient to encourage the animal to leave the area. To discourage wildlife from coming down into Monrovia neighborhoods, residents need to keep food, trash and sources out of reach of wildlife.

## CITY OF MONROVIA RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM

The City of Monrovia Residential Rehabilitation Home Improvement Program provides grants to eligible homeowners of single family detached homes to ensure decent, safe and sanitary housing for Monrovians. Grants can be given to correct hazardous conditions, make improvements to eliminate blight, improve handicap access, and to correct building and health code violations. This program is made possible by Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) funds awarded to the City for residential preservation.

A limited number of grants are available to single family, owner occupied residential properties in our Low-Moderate Income Census Tracts on a first come-first served basis.





#### **GRANT PRIORITIES**

- Code Corrections
- Smoke detectors
- Exterior weatherproofing
- ADA rails and handicap devices
- Repair plaster, siding stucco
- Elimination of specific conditions detrimental to public health and safety.
- Testing/treatment of lead based paint and/or asbestos
- Chain Link Fence Removal
- Fencing Repairs
- Repair, replacement of doors windows, screens
- Removal of Security Bars
- Roofing Repair/Replacement

\*INCOME RESTRICTIONS APPLY. ALL PROGRAMS FOR GRANT ASSISTANCE ARE SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL FUNDING.



- Issuing notices of compliance when applicable



#### **Code Enforcement Tip**

Yard sale season is here!

Code Enforcement wants to remind Monrovia residents of a few things to keep in mind before holding your yard sale. A permit is required. The cost is \$5.00 and can be purchased at the Community Development counter at Monrovia City Hall or at the Monrovia Police Department when City Hall is closed. Failure to obtain the permit could ultimately result in a citation.

The permit is good for two consecutive days, and a yard sale can be held only once every six months. Two signs advertising your sale may be posted on your yard. If your car is legally parked on a street in Monrovia, you may place a sign on or in your car to advertise your yard sale.

Please do not place signs on city property. Signs are not permitted on utility poles (power or telephone), light standards, street trees, sidewalks, or the like, or on private property without the owner's permission.

In an effort to keep Monrovia premier, Code Enforcement Staff will be verifying yard sale permits and removing any yard sale signs posted on city property on weekends.
