Lt. Col. Allensworth

On March 10, 2018, MAP celebrated our first Neighborhood Treasure, Lt. Col. Allen Allensworth and with much excitement in the air, you could just barely feel the chill from the coming rain. We learned so much about our first Treasure from all of the speakers and family members!

But really quick, what is Neighborhood Treasures? MAP Staff attend a conference every year called Neighborhoods, USA (NUSA). We get to see what people all over the country are doing to inspire their neighborhoods and work together for a greater good. There was a city in lowa who was celebrating historians in their city and it got us thinking ... Monrovia has a lot of great people who have helped make this City the gem that it is. Neighborhood Treasures is a program that exists to celebrate unsung heroes of Monrovia through art and education. In conjunction with the Monrovia Art in Public Places Committee, each person celebrated (there will be two more in 2018!) will have an art piece from a local artist specific to whom the treasure was. In addition, we have done extensive research with local historians, MAP Leaders, and even reaching out to family members of the treasures to accurately tell their stories to everyone.

Here's a little bit of information about our first Treasure: Lt. Col. Allensworth was born into slavery in April 1842 in Kentucky. He later escaped during the American Civil War and served in the United States Army, where he became the first African American to reach the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Later, Lt. Col. Allensworth decided to dedicate his life to pursuing expanded education, economic, and political opportunities for African Americans in California, where his journey led him to Monrovia. In 1906, he became the first pastor of Monrovia's Second Baptist Church, where his legacy is carried on today as a prominent place of worship in Monrovia for more over 110 years.

As a special note, the artist who designed the memorial recognizing Lt. Col. Allensworth is none other than Second Baptist Church's very own Ron Husband, who was also the first African American Disney animator.

At the dedication event, special guest Charles Allensworth, great-great nephew to the late Lt. Col. Allensworth, was on hand to honor his family's legacy.

The City PROUDLY introduces: GOMonrovia! Starting on March 17, 2018, you'll be able to take a Lyft ride anywhere in the Monrovia service area for just \$0.50!

Additionally, the community is about to get a lot more green – lime green to be exact! LimeBike, one of the nation's leading bike-share providers, is now operating in Monrovia. Unlike traditional bike-share services that require you to pick up and drop off bikes at a few designated dock locations, LimeBike is completely dockless! After downloading the LimeBike app, riders simply locate a nearby bike on the map using GPS technology, scan the code to unlock the bike, and ride to their destination! LimeBikes are available for \$1.00 for a 30-minute ride, or \$29.95 for 100 rides per month

# Community Development Block Grant

As you may know by now, MAP has amazing programs that are all about YOU. How can we, as City staff, best help our residents be successful and get the most out of their community? One of our many ways includes the Community Development Block Grant Residential Home Improvement Grant Program.

The intent of the City of Monrovia Residential Rehabilitation Home Improvement Grant is to provide grants to eligible homeowners / occupants of single family detached homes for the preservation of decent, safe and sanitary housing; to correct hazardous conditions; to make improvements to eliminate blight and improve handicapped access; and to correct building and health code violations through the awarding of Community Development Block Grants (CDBG). All properties to be repaired must be a single family residence located in the a low-moderate income census tract and be within the City limits of Monrovia. We have three homeowners who received big improvements done to their home! The improvements made to the homes change the way people are able to live in their homes and have (slightly) less stress. Especially when it comes to things like not having your roof leak.









This homeowner needed railing so she could safely use her front and back porches. In addition to that, due to the age of the home, her plaster ceiling was falling and the basement door wasn't even usable anymore. These small changes lead to a better quality of life (and no chance of plaster falling from the sky!) for the whole family.

















This homeowner had her roof for 20 years, and had obviously served its' purpose and it was time for a new roof. In addition to a new roof and fixing the damaged eaves, we also worked with the homeowner to get her house painted for a full home makeover. The results look great!







Turns out, old homes have old roofs. We assisted this homeowner in helping her get a new roof as well, which also helped with a small leak issue that began last year after it rained last year.

### **Neighborhood Treasures**

As we mentioned earlier, there are two more treasures this year...ready for a sneak peek?

August 18, 2018-We will be celebrating Ms. Kate Wright.

Ms. Wright and her son, Marshall, lived with a minister and his family and moved to Monrovia in 1900. She informed others that she had a conversation with God one day, and decided to devote her life to care for the sick and the poor from that moment on. Through donations of supplies and labor, she built small cottages on her property where she tended for patients suffering from tuberculosis who had no family or resources to assist them.

Wright also collected food for holiday baskets for those in need, Baker said, acting as a precursor to today's Foothill Unity Center,

She received no financial compensation for any of her services. Ms. Wright continued to selflessly support others for over 30 years. She died in 1937 and is buried at Live Oak Cemetery.

Doesn't she sound incredible? It is our privilege to honor such a humble treasure. Stay tuned for more information about her and the block party celebration in her honor.

### **Community Policing Tip**

As the rain slowly goes away and the weather warms up, we encourage people to get out and ride bicycles along Monrovia's new bike paths called "sharrows." You may have seen the symbol painted on several of our streets recently, which looks like two arrows above the bicyclist symbol as a reminder to motorists that they must share the road with bicyclists.

The California Vehicle Code regulates how people are to operate motor vehicles and bicycles on public roadways. Along with helmets, required to be worn by all cyclists under 18 years old, there are several other laws bicyclists and motorists must follow so that everyone stays safe and can enjoy a Southern California drive or ride along our roads.

We want to remind all bicyclists that they are to obey all the

driving rules of the road that motor vehicles follow, which includes stopping at stop signs and stop lights. Bicyclists must remember that while riding on the roadway you are to obey all vehicle codes just like a motor vehicle.

Motorists must remember that California has a new law that requires motor vehicles to stay a minimum of 3 feet from all bike riders. These and the other rules of the road are not designed by our law makers to be a burden on Californians, but to keep us all safe and able to enjoy our beautiful state for years to come.

### **Code Enforcement Tip**

Summer is almost here which means - mosquito season is upon us. Monrovia residents and businesses share the responsibility of vector control and we count on you to eliminate the potential mosquito infestations at your home and place of business. Here are a few helpful tips to make sure your outdoor summer fun is mosquito free.



Remove all stagnant water - take the time to walk around your patio or yard about once a week to make sure there is no standing water that would make a good harborage for mosquito breeding. Mosquitos can lay eggs in the smallest pools of stagnant water (like water collected under plant saucers).
