



What are Footnotes?

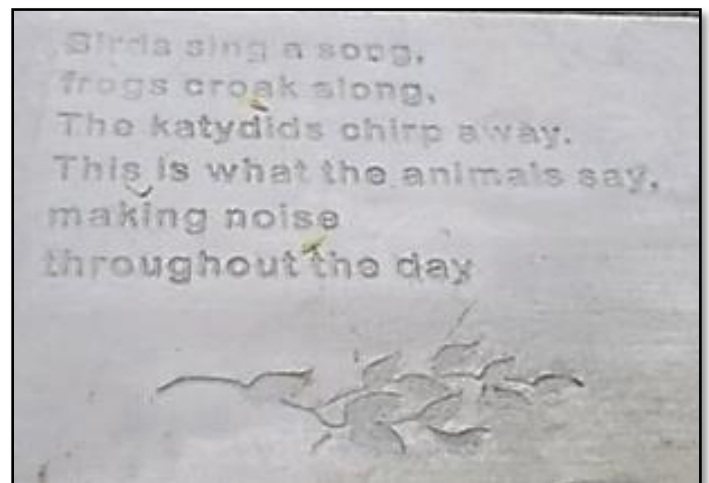
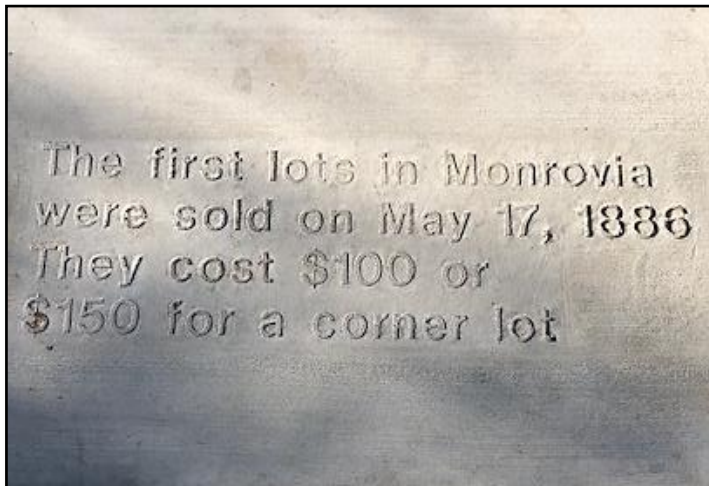
The City of Monrovia places high value on public art and the cultural, social, and economic benefits it provides public spaces. One of Monrovia's ongoing art components is called "Footnotes." Footnotes are comprised of sidewalk poetry (short writings submitted by residents) and "Monrovia moments" (fun historical tidbits) that will be stamped into newly poured sidewalks throughout the City.

How Can I get Involved?
