TITLE: 2019 Friday Night Teen Scene Overview

OBJECTIVE: To provide an update on statistics and activities related to the 2019 Friday Teen Scene program.

BACKGROUND: The Friday Night Teen Scene began several years ago in partnership with the City of Monrovia, Monrovia Unified School District, Santa Anita Family YMCA, members from the faith based community, and City of Duarte. The original goal of the program was to provide teens with a safe space to gather on Friday nights. The Old Town Merchants had expressed the need for a productive and safe environment for the teens, separate from the Friday Night Street Fair. The original program included a leadership component, where participating teens learned about leadership and developed communication and job skills. Program participants attended the leadership classes and worked together to provide eight (8) weeks of activities for their peers in Library Park during the summer.

Over the years, the program and partners have evolved. In 2018, the City collaborated with Raw Inspirations, the Friday Night Street Fair operator, to provide the Friday Night Teen Scene as a feature in the Street Fair. In addition, to enhance the Youth Employment Services (YES) Program, staff suggested a YES Intern take the lead on the event programming. Coordination of the activities were planned in partnership with Raw Inspirations and the program was held on Colorado Boulevard, east of Myrtle Avenue. Although Raw Inspirations were great partners, hosting the Friday Night Teen Scene on the street as a part of the Fair created new challenges. Unfortunately, the teens did not respond positively to the changes and the participation decreased significantly.

This year, once again staff identified a YES Intern to assist with the planning, promotion and execution of the Friday Night Teen Scene. The program was held in Library Park from 5:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. for eight weeks beginning on Friday, June 28 and ending on Friday, August 16. The YES Intern worked with staff, various community service groups, and non-profit organizations to provide a safe and engaging environment for teens to spend time with their friends listening to music, playing sports, engaging in art activities, and enjoying a weekly free meal.

ANALYSIS: The Friday Night Teen Scene was the capstone project for the YES Intern assigned to the program. The YES Intern worked with staff to schedule activities such as a Cell Phone Public Art Photo Scavenger Hunt, Basketball Shootout and teen bands. Food, craft supplies and in- kind donations were secured from the City Council, City of Monrovia Administrative Services Department, Monrovia Fire Department Explorers, the Monrovia Police Department Explores, the Monrovia Area Partnership Youth Leadership Program, the Monrovia Youth Commission, Old Town Merchants, Monrovia Association of

Fine Arts, Volunteer Center of San Gabriel Valley, Canyon Park Naturalists, and the Monrovia Teen Advisory Board.

Relocating the program back to Library Park provided a centralized location for teens to spend their Friday nights. The YES Intern assigned to the program developed innovative programs and assisted with social media promotions. Attendance increased each week with the highest attendance on July 26, August 9, and August 16 when live music was provided by teen bands. Staff also observed an increase in weekly attendance later in the evening when the weather was cooler.

- 3. Continue to partner with service groups, City departments and non-profit organizations for food donations, art and craft activities, and in-kind donations.
- 4. Schedule more teen bands to perform each week.
- 5. Shift the program time from 5:30 p.m. 8:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m.
