A petition from property owners was submitted requesting installation of Permit Parking signs.

Tim & Annalisa Siregar	Public Input (items not on the agenda)	Respectfully request the City Council to implement a strategic plan and related public report outlining the Council's actions taken, resources dedicated, and accountability measures instated to ensure people of color and specifically, Black People in this city will 1) never be criminalized based on the color of their skin & 2) never experience excessive force, violence and death; and asks how Monrovia police officer training will change to ensure against racist actions or unjust police brutality, and how such a plan will be made transparent to residents of Monrovia.
Jason Greenspan	AR-2	Strongly supports the ordinance related to permitted tree species, believes Monrovia's urban forest and overall street tree canopy are community resources that should continue to be highly valued, preserved and enhanced, that encouraging a wider palette of native street trees will support reduction of greenhouse gases, sequestration of carbon, and minimize urban heat islands, and hopes that all new development in the City will be required to select trees from the new list.

In addition to parking, the traffic both ways has increased in number and speed, thus providing a potential for endangering the foot traffic and especially the small children who live on Oakglade since there are no sidewalks..

This is a long-standing problem which has been made far worse by the pandemic and the closing of the park.
