TITLE: Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for July 2020

OBJECTIVE: To provide an update on incidents, maintenance, and public comments related to Canyon Park and the Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP) recorded for the month of July 2020.

BACKGROUND: For over a century, Canyon Park has been used as a recreational park by visitors and Monrovia residents. Services in Canyon Park include special events; Naturalist led night hikes, interpretive tours, a Nature Center, trails, a waterfall, and views of the San Gabriel Valley. In addition, Naturalists and volunteers maintain the trail systems and facilities.

In 2016, the City opened over 4.5 miles of HWP trials providing passive recreational opportunities for the community. Park Naturalists patrol the HWP and urban parks two times a day by vehicle, utility terrain vehicle and foot. Park Naturalists also respond to calls related to Monrovia's Smoking Ban Ordinance.

On Friday, March 13, 2020, in response to the potential exposure of COVID-19 and under the guidance received by local, state and federal officials, the decision was made to close the Community Center, Library, HWP and Canyon Park to the public.

In effort to provide recreation for the community the decision was made to reopen HWP and Canyon Park on Tuesday, March 17, 2020. All programs were canceled and facilities remained closed. During the reopening weekend, excessive crowds gathered in HWP and Canyon Park. Due to the lack of respect for the health guidelines by the park visitors, such as wearing face masks and social distancing, the decision was made again close HWP and Canyon Park until further notice. Park Naturalist have remained at the entrance gate at Canyon Park to ensure the park security.

On May 7, 2020, the Governor's Office lifted portion of the Safer at Home Order to allow for the reopening of trails as part of a multi-phased approach to allow public access to outdoor recreational facilities throughout Los Angeles County. In preparation of trail openings, guidelines were developed which included: operational hour limitations, various trail restrictions, maintenance protocols, monitoring recommendations, and other key considerations. These protocols were developed in consultation with the County Department of Public Health and in coordination with federal, state, and local trail managing partners. Adherence to the plan is critical to safely operate these important facilities so the community can enjoy the emotional and physical benefits provided by hiking and riding on trails.

On Friday, May 8, 2020 HWP and Sawpit Wash reopened to hikers and mountain bikers, however sections of narrow trails remained closed or modified to create one-way loops to ensure physical

distancing. The "Expereinced Hiker Trail" and "Bobcat Ridge Trail" remain closed in HWP since social distancing cannot be maintained. Since Canyon Park qualifies as a high use trail, additional safety measures and monitoring protocols were necessary and delayed the opening of the Park.

On Tuesday, May 26, 2020 Canyon Park reopened to the public through a reservation only online system. The new reservation system helps ensure a limited number of visitors, both residents and nonresidents, have the opportunity to enjoy Canyon Park while also managing large crowds. Reservations are limited to 70 per timeslot, with three timeslots available every weekday. All visitors looking to enter the park must have a reservation, whether driving, biking or walking into Canyon Park. A \$5.00 parking fee is required for visitors to park inside Canyon Park.

Trail modifications were established to ensure safe, physical distancing such as:

- One-Way Trail Loops
- Portions of the Waterfall Trail and Ben Overturf Trail closed
- Limited Trail Use Hours
 - Monday Friday: 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
 - Closed Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays

ANALYSIS: During the month of July 2020, Park Naturalist worked on maintaining Canyon Park's hiking trails. Canyon Park Volunteers completed 126 hours of miantenace on various hiking trails and roadways in Canyon Park. The maintenance included brush clearace, tree removal and erosion control.

For the month of July staff monitored two brush fires in neighboring areas of San Gabriel Valley. The Chantry Fire, July 20th and the Dam Fire, July 30th were closly monitored by staff and the Monroivia Fire Department. The fires did not pose a threat to Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve, keeping the areas open to the public.

Below you will find the details related to the trail reservation system during the month of July for the reservation program. Staff is monitoring trail use through the reservations system and have continued to receive postitive feedback on how organized the system is and how safe patrons feel when hiking Canyon Park.
