#### What is the Census?

- Every 10 years the Census records everyone living in this Country.
- The Census counts everyone living at your address on April 1
- The data is used to fund services such as:

Older people and low-income populations:

- Medicare
- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)

#### College Students:

- ❖ Federal Pell Grants
- Career and technical education grants
- Adult education grants

#### Young Children:

- Head Start
- National School Lunch Program
- Title IX funding

## Funding


- ► For every person <u>not</u> counted in the upcoming 2020 Census, California will lose roughly \$19,500 in Federal funding over the next 10 years.
- Hypothetical: If we undercount 100 people in Monrovia, that equates to a loss of roughly \$1,950,000 in California's federal funding.

### Representation

▶ For the first time ever, California could lose a congressional seat

# Monrovia Response Rate to Date Current: 71.7% 2010: 73.5%

- ► Hard to Count Tract
  - Response Rate: 63.0%
    - up 4.8% since 8/4
  - 2010 Final Self-Response Rate: 71.3%
  - Multi Family Housing
  - Limited Computer/Internet Access
  - Language barriers
