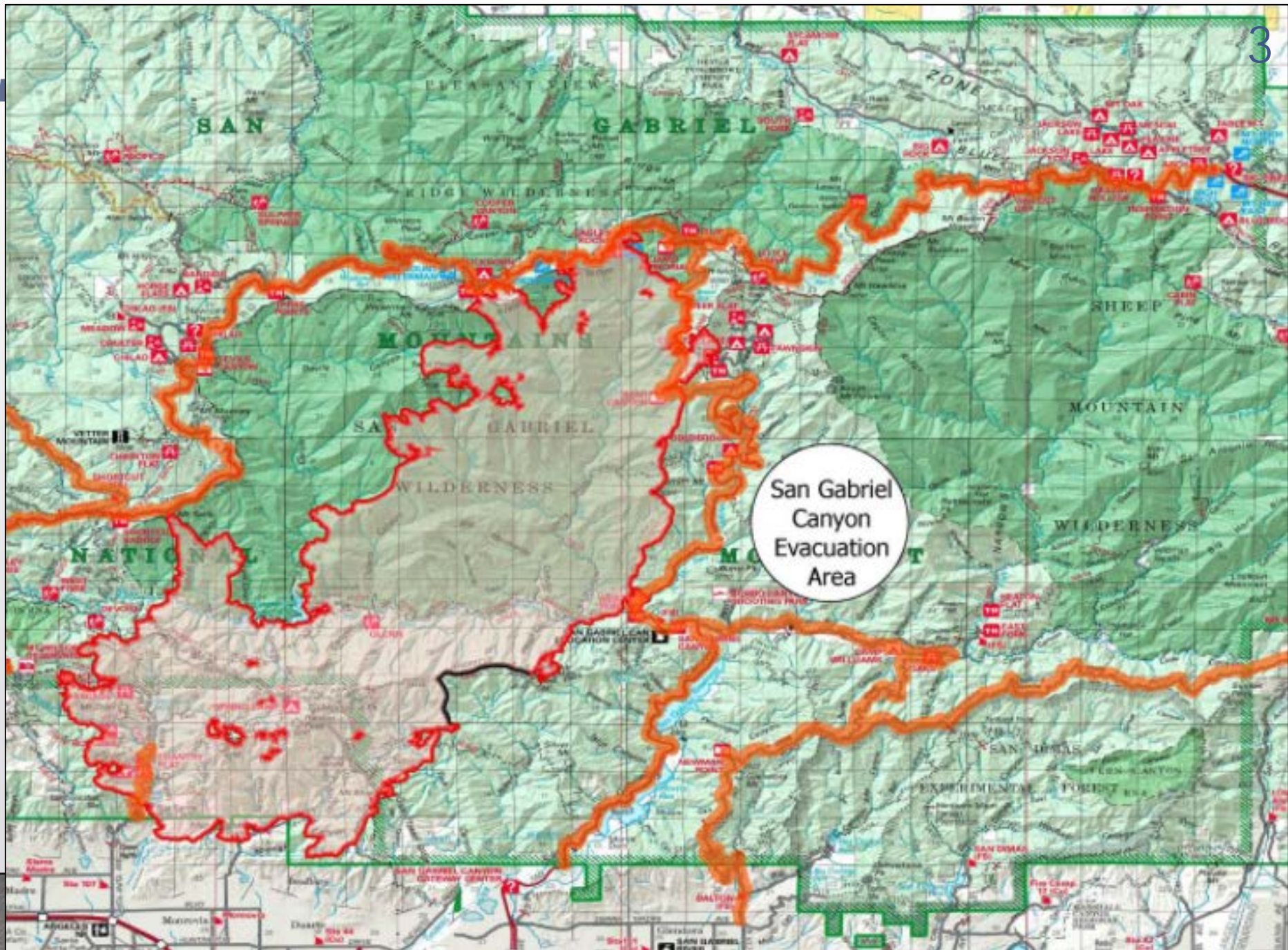

- Emergency Operations Center Level 1 Activated Monday, September 7, 2020
- City Manager/Emergency Services
Director Declares Local Emergency Sunday, September 10, 2020
- Evacuation Warning Issued: Monday, September 7, 2020
- EOC Activation Level 2 Friday, September 11, 2020
- ***City Council Emergency Declaration*** ***Tuesday, September 15, 2020***
- Estimated Containment Date: Saturday, October 31, 2020

City Facilities

- All facilities remain closed to the public due to the pandemic but open for virtual business.
- Community Policing Room opened for Emergency Operations Center
 - Desk lines
 - Internet connections
 - Dedicated tables for sections (Planning, Fire, Finance, Law Enforcement, Logistics)
 - COVID-19 screening
- Community Center
 - Opened as Information & Cooling Center

City Staff Assignments


- Over 30 staff assigned to EOC in initial days
 - 24/7 operations
 - CERT volunteers necessary to success
 - Overnight hotline w/ Dispatchers and CERT Volunteers

Department	Functions
Administrative Services	Finance, EOC Screening
City Manager's Office	Incident Management, Communications
Community Development	Incident Action Planning
Community Services	Information & Cooling Center, Logistics
Fire	Wildland Fire Suppression, Maps & Intel, Strike Team Leader
Police	Patrol, Evacuation Team, Traffic Control, Drone Patrol
Public Works	Roadblocks, Water System Maintenance



Major Decision-Making

- Unified Command
- May 2020 – Statewide Standard Evacuation Terminology
- Evacuation Warning vs Evacuation Order
- Extra Mutual Aid Strike Team
- Water quality, quantity and pressure
- Fire Management Assistance Grant, or FMAG

- Fire is still active!
- Initial Damage Assessment
- Burned Area Emergency Response Team, or BAER Team
- Collaborative Efforts
 - Area D - Disaster Management
 - Legislative Assistance – Federal & State
 - Fire Management Assistance Grant, or FMAG
