### In the beginning...

1980 Monrovia Old House Preservation Group formed.

**1982** First MOHPG Home Tour

1985 Historic Resources Survey conducted. This was a joint effort between MOHPG and the City of Monrovia

### A program is established...

- 1992 Historic Preservation Advisory Committee appointed by the City Council.
- 1994 Draft Historic Preservation Ordinance released for public review.
- **1995** Ordinance No. 95-01 adopted April 4, 1995.
- 1995 Historic Preservation Commission appointed. First meeting held on September 26, 1995.

## 1996 First five Historic Landmarks designated and Mills Act Contracts approved:

- ► Historic Preservation Commission April 24, 1996
- City Council June 4, 1996

**2016** Demolition Review Ordinance adopted (2016-10)

## Historic Preservation by the numbers...
