BACKGROUND

- On March 16, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LA DPH) issued a Safer at Home Order to "flatten the curve."
- On April 14, 2020, the LA DPH mandates Essential Businesses to require employees wear cloth face coverings while performing duties that involve contact with others.
- On Thursday, June 18, 2020, the California Department of Public Health released a guidance mandating that face coverings should be worn state-wide.
- On Friday, June 19, 2020, LA DPH amends Health Order to "require all persons wear a cloth face covering over both the nose and mouth whenever they leave their place of residence and are or can be in contact with or walking near or past others who are non-household members in both public and private places, whether indoors or outdoors"
- On January 20, 202, Presidential Executive Order on Protecting the Federal Workforce and Requiring Mask-Wearing.

My Account

- If a citation were to be given to a person who is not wearing a face covering, these charges would be sent to the LA County District Attorney's Office. Given the current circumstances, it is most likely that the DA's office will not prosecute these citations.
- As an example, citations given to protesters for failure to disperse, curfews and other code violations were mostly dismissed.

The City of Monrovia continues to focus our efforts on education and compliance. If the need arises, we'll continue working in partnership with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health to ensure our community understands the face covering requirements.

Between October 2nd and February 20th, 16 citations have been issued to 9 different Monrovia businesses.
