TITLE: Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for May 2021.

OBJECTIVE: To provide an update on incidents, maintenance, and public comments related to Canyon Park and the Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP) recorded for the month of May 2021.

BACKGROUND: For over a century, Canyon Park has been used as a recreational park by visitors and Monrovia residents. Services in Canyon Park include special events; Naturalist led night hikes, interpretive tours, a Nature Center, trails, a waterfall, and views of the San Gabriel Valley. In addition, Naturalists and volunteers maintain the trail systems and facilities.

In 2016, the City opened over 4.5 miles of HWP trials providing passive recreational opportunities for the community. Park Naturalists patrol the HWP and urban parks two times a day by vehicle, utility terrain vehicle and foot. Park Naturalists also respond to calls related to Monrovia's Smoking Ban Ordinance.

On September 12, the Bobcat Fire entered Monrovia Canyon Park, firefighters used a defensive approach to protect buildings and structures, including the Nature Center, Ranger Station, Cabin, and restrooms. The fire suppression tactics, which included controlled burns, burned a significant amount of brush in the park but all buildings remain intact with only smoke damage. Popular hiking trails are no longer accessible and debris from high above is already rolling down the hills and landing on park trails. In total, about 278 acres of Monrovia owned open space (including 80 acres of Monrovia Canyon Park) was damaged. With the need for ongoing damage assessments and emergency preventative measures, the City anticipate the park will be closed for some time. During this time, to secure Monrovia Canyon Park, a secondary fence has been installed at the gate to further secure the park after hours. Additionally, signs are posted as the area remains very dangerous.

The post Bobcat Fire, Burn Emergency Area Respose (BEAR) report from the US Forest Service Department shows potential rainfalls this winter and spring season creating heavy mud and debris flows in Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve. Staff is prepared to handle each incident with a case by case study after each rain event to assess damanges and a response type based on each outcome.

Due to minimal damage in Hillside Wilderness Preserve the trail systems reopened on November 16, 2020. Limited hiking opportunites in San Gabriel Valley such as Canyon Park, Sturdevent Falls, Hwy 39, and Eaton Canyon has increased amount of daily visitors to the Hillside Wildereness Preserve, primarily at Ridgeside and Cloverleaf access points.

ANALYSIS: During the month of May 2021, Canyon Park Volunteers and Park Naturalists completed 124 hours of maintenance in Canyon Park. Maintenance preformance included clearing debris on the hiking trails, and brush clearance around the facility picnic grounds.

On May 13 and 14 staff worked closely with the Monrovia Fire Department to host and participate in an advanced chainsaw training course held in Canyon Park. This training course allowed staff to become properly trained and certified to drop larger size trees creating a hazard within the park. The trees used during this exercise were dead or dying as a result of the Bobcat Fire. This training, allowed several trees to be removed at no cost to the City.

On May 24, Bellfree Contractors started work on the Bill Cull trail, rebuilding and stabilizing the trail that eroded from the Bobcat fire. The trail repair work is scheduled to take 3-5 weeks to complete.

On May 25 and 26, staff met with Cal OES respresentatives to conduct a site visit and check on damages in Canyon Park and City Facilites realted to the Bobcat Fire. Staff continue to work with State to identify potential funding to cover the cost to rebuild the park and faciliites.

On May 27, staff toured Hillside Wilderness Preserve to identify potential locations for destination points and benches along the hiking trail in an effort to continue to enhance HWP.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Community Services Commission move to receive and file CC-2, Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for May 2021.
