




Celebrating Neighborhood Treasures



Overview

- Neighborhood Treasures began in 2018 and celebrates historically and culturally significant Monrovians through the installation of public art
- It is a vital element of the City's Art in Public Places program and plays a central role in making Monrovia a vibrant and culturally rich community.
- Treasures are identified based on input from local historians and MAP Leaders
- The program is vetted by MAP Leaders
- Each piece is designed by an artist selected through a competitive process and is unique to the honoree
- Treasures are placed in specific neighborhoods relevant to the identified community member

Art Details

- Treasures include different artwork styles, themes and media.
- The art is attached to a post with a plaque that provides data on the recipient.
- Sizes vary but are typically nine feet tall by three feet wide

2022 Treasure

Almera Romney believed that all children, regardless of their ethnicity, should be treated equally. Over her 17-year tenure at Huntington Elementary School, Monrovia's segregated School, as a teacher and then principal, she fought the School District to draw resources and attention to give her students a good education. From 1946 to 1963, Ms. Romney was the driving force that transformed Huntington Elementary School from an underresourced and physically unsafe school to a place where students thrived academically and socially. She ensured students felt safe and valued.

2022 Treasure

Josephine Anderson was the strong and capable leader who created and built what has become one of the best known and effective organizations in Monrovia and the San Gabriel Valley, the Foothill Unity Center. Josephine was in charge of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church's food program in the late 1970's when she realized that those needing food were going from church to church seeking help. She called the leaders of the various church programs together and Unity Center was born.





STEPS TO START YOUR BUDGET

01 Let's gets into the mindset


Take a deep breath, think of some personal goals - maybe it's a vacation, retirement, a college fund, or a rainy day reserve – and let's get to it!

Let's calculate our income

Think about every source of income, such as your employment, investment income, businesses, etc. 02 Let's g

Gather all relevant information and documents, such as bank statements, copy of paystubs, login information to utility bill accounts, credit card bills, mortgage statements, etc.



Think about the mortgage, rent, car payments, insurance, groceries, utilities, personal care, medical expenses, child care, savings, student loans, etc.

Let's plan for variable expenses

Some expenses aren't the same every month. Think about birthdays, the holidays, milestones, etc. Things like eating out and entertainment can definitely add up.


06 Let's e

Emergencies happen. Set aside some moneys for an emergency or surprise fund.

Let's calculate our income against all those expenses

If your income is higher than your expenses, you're off to a great start!



If your expenses are higher than your income, let's make some modifications to your variable expenses, and find savings in your fixed expenses.


Let's adjust our expenses, if need

ADDITIONAL BUDGETING INFO

 Make a new budget, before the month begins.

 Create a schedule, watch automated payments, and track your progress.

Leave a buffer, and don't forget to set aside for emergencies.



ADDITIONAL BUDGETING INFO

Zero-Based Budgeting

Budgeting method that allocates all money to expenses, savings, and debt repayments, so that at the end of the month, you have zero dollars left to allocate.



ADDITIONAL BUDGETING INFO

50 / 30 / 20 Budgeting

50%: Goes to essentials

30%: Goes to wants

20%: Goes to savings and debt repayment






Budgeting can be simple!



Take a close look at your income and your expenses. Account for emergencies, variable expenses, stay accountable, and track your progress.






