Background



Phase II - Mandatory Conservation

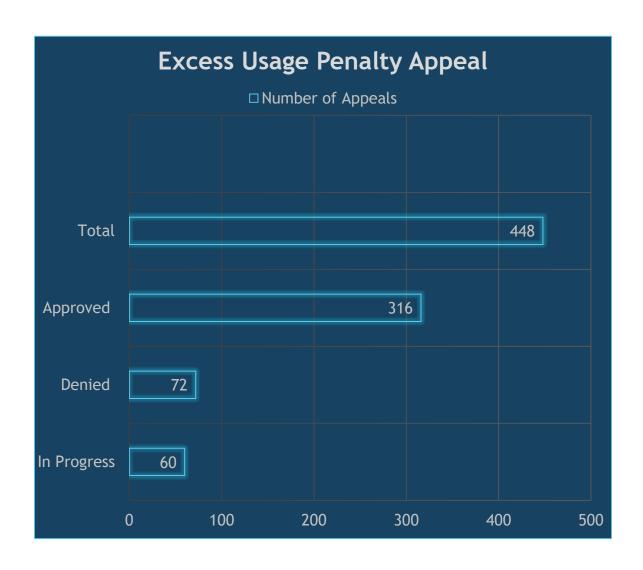
- Phase II requires mandatory water use restrictions and water conservation of 10% from the base period allocation (year 2020).
- Residents and businesses who exceed 90% of their base period allocation, are charged a penalty rate for each unit in excess.

Excess Usage Penalty Appeals

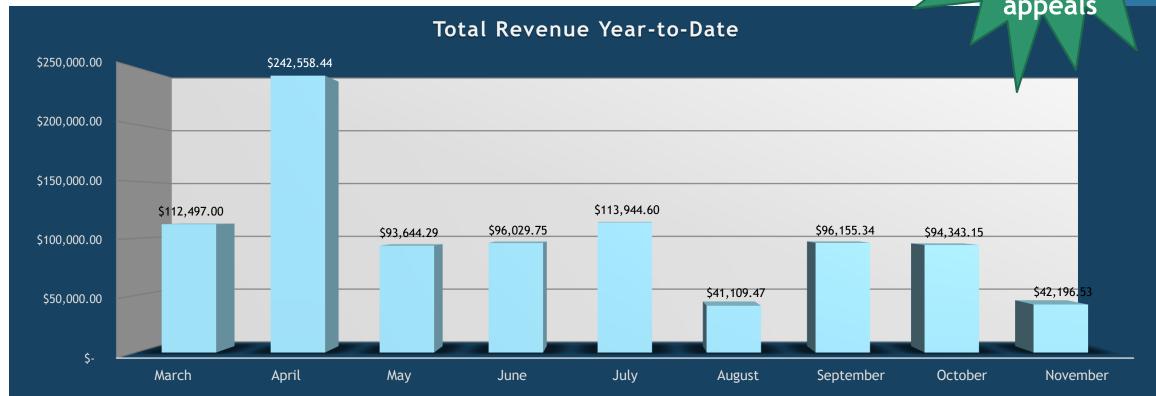


- Each appeal is reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
- Taking the following into consideration:
 - Conservation measures taken
 - Reason for appeal
 - Comparison to same account type in the same route
 - Account history

Excess Usage Penalty Revenue

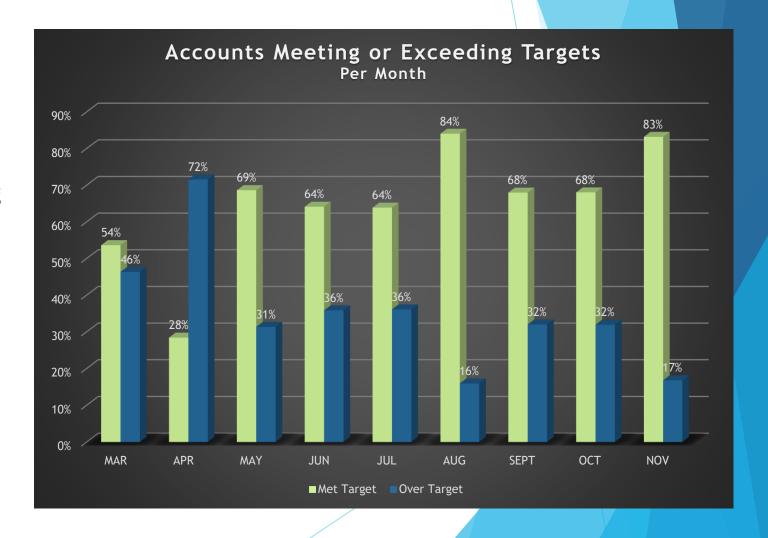




Revenue year-to-date: \$907,478.30

Phase II Trends

- The number of accounts that have met their targets has been increasing since the start of the program in March 2022.
- April targets were lower causing a spike in account exceeding their targets.

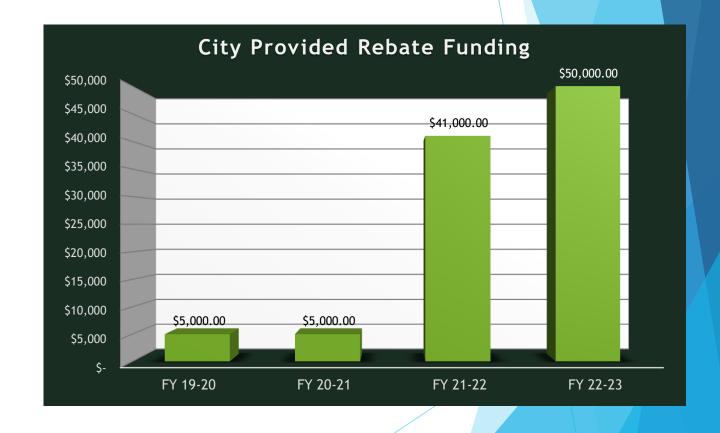
Residential/Commercial Turf Replacement Program

- Goal: Expansion of this program for commercial customer's to encourage replacement of nonfunctional turf
- > The City of Monrovia has partnered with the Upper San Gabriel Water District to provide incentives for residents and businesses to replace their turf with native and drought tolerant plants.
- The City currently offers a rebate of \$3.00/ sq. ft.



Current Residential Turf Replacement Program

- Due to increasing demand and popularity of the program, the City increased the budget for the residential rebate program.
- Funding dramatically increased after the start of Phase II of the Water Conservation Plan in March 2022.

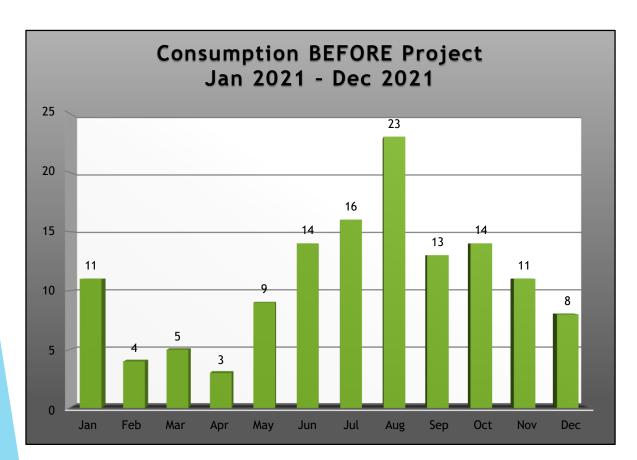

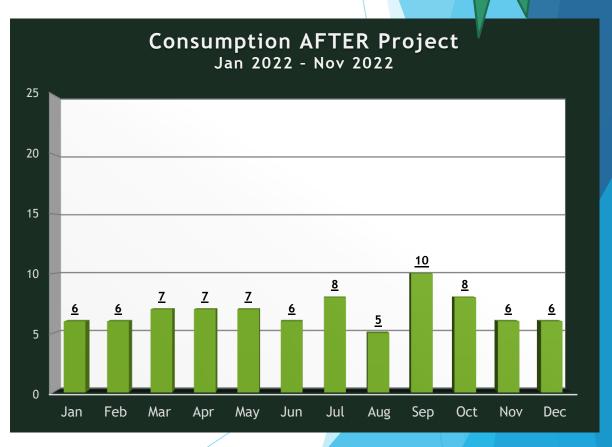

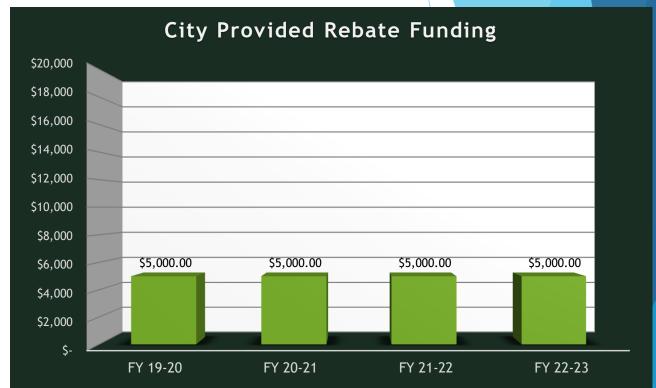
Current Commercial Turf Replacement Program

Commercial rebate funding has remained the same... but not for lack of interest!

- Commercial projects tend to be larger in size and therefore require more funding per project.
- Commercial projects would benefit the most because they use the majority of their water on nonfunctional turf and outdoor irrigation.

Looking Ahead - 2023 Water Restriction Legislation

- New legislation targets turf irrigation for <u>commercial</u>, <u>industrial</u> and <u>institutional</u> areas.
- Removing turf would reduce costs for businesses while maintaining beautification with native, drought tolerant plants.

Watering of non-functional turf in commercial, industrial and institutional areas <u>becomes</u> <u>prohibited</u> for all Californians





The State Water Board <u>passed a ban</u> on watering of non-functional turf irrigation in commercial, industrial and institutional areas.

Water Audit Program

- Goal: Expansion of this program to all residential and commercial accounts in Monrovia. Further conservation efforts with direct assistance.
- In December 2022, Council approved the agreement with the Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water District (USGVMWD) for grant funding for an irrigation survey program.
- Grant funding targets customer's who have received a penalty and have been denied their appeal.
- Focuses on outdoor conservation.



Water Audit Program

Number

Roughly 50% of daily water use goes towards outdoor watering.

Properly managed irrigation systems can <u>reduce water use by nearly 9,000</u> <u>gallons of water</u> (equivalent to 500 showers)

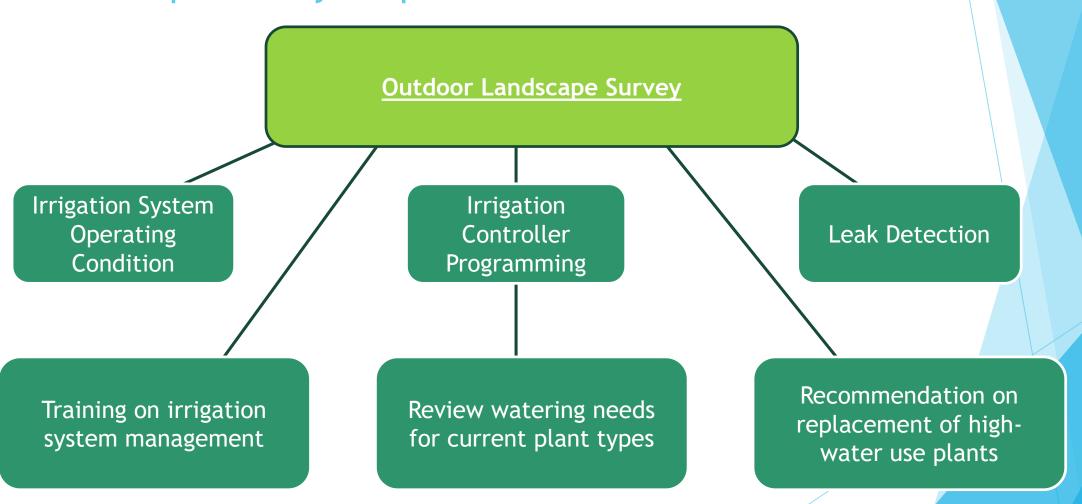

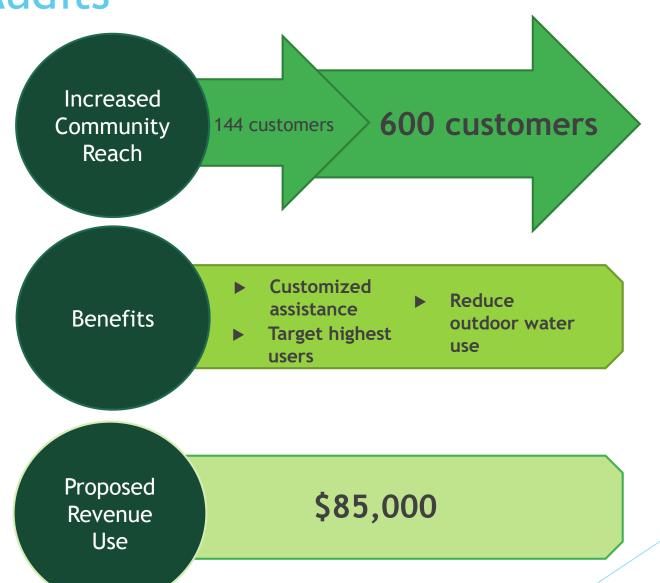
