TITLE: Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for December 2022.

**OBJECTIVE:** To provide an update on incidents, maintenance, and public comments related to Canyon Park and the Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP) recorded for the month of December 2022.

**BACKGROUND:** For over a century, Canyon Park has been used as a recreational park by visitors and Monrovia residents. Services in Canyon Park include special events; Naturalist led night hikes, interpretive tours, a Nature Center, trails, a waterfall, and views of the San Gabriel Valley. In addition, Naturalists and volunteers maintain the trail systems and facilities.

In 2016, the City opened over 4.5 miles of HWP trials providing passive recreational opportunities for the community. Park Naturalists patrol the HWP and urban parks two times a day by vehicle, utility terrain vehicle and foot. Park Naturalists also respond to calls related to Monrovia's Smoking Ban Ordinance.

In September 2020, the Bobcat Fire forced the closure of Canyon Park and HWP for an extended period of time, as the areas were unsafe and significant repairs were needed.

Due to minimal damage in HWP following the Bobcat Fire, the trail systems reopened on November 16, 2020. Limited hiking opportunities in San Gabriel Valley such as Canyon Park, Sturdevent Falls, Hwy 39, and Eaton Canyon has increased amount of daily visitors to HWP, primarily in Ridgeside and Cloverleaf access points.

Staff worked diligently to repair trails and remove hazards in an effort to open Canyon Park as soon as possible. On August 30, 2021 Canyon Park was reopened to the public through a reservation system to ease visitors back into the Park. Staff continue to work on remediating potential hazards and improve trail conditions for Park users. Future wind and rain events may temporarily close the Park as needed to improve safety conditions for Park users.

The first significant rain event following the Bobcat Fire occurred on December 13, 2021. The National Weather Service reported that the event accumulated over 5 inches of rain which caused significant damage to Canyon Park. Monrovia Canyon Park will remain closed indefinitely for a period of time. During the duration of the closure, photos, aerial footage, and much more information will be shared with the community.

Staff has been intimately involved with cleanup and rehabilitation towards Canyon Park roads, trails and infrastructure. Over the next several months Staff will continue to assess and identify damages from the

December 2021 rainstorm clean up, identify infrastructure repairs, and oversee the possibilities of upgrades to Canyon Park.

**ANALYSIS:** During the month of December 2022, Canyon Park Volunteers completed 115 hours of maintenance in Canyon Park. Maintenance performance included debris removal from the trail, installation of edge barriers to prevent trail erosion, and reestablishing the trails to prepare for incoming rainfall.

During the month of December, Management Career Solutions (MCS) assisted with post fire recovery in Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve (HWP). Recovery efforts include ash and debris removal that fell on the trail, cutting up fallen trees, invasive species removal from the stream bed and erosion mitigations. Staff is working with MCS to prepare and respond to rain events that may affect the park, preserve and trail systems.

December 1– Canyon Park assisted in the Annual City of Monrovia Holiday Parade. Staff assisted with line route management and public safety. The parade brought out spectators to gather on Myrtle Ave to see a holiday parade of Community Groups and Members along with Santa riding in to ring in the holiday season.

December 5 - 9 - Canyon Park Staff joined Monrovia Police and Fire with the Annual Monrovia citywide Santa Tours. Staff decorated vehicles with holiday attire to add and enhance the Santa tour experience. Each day of the week Santa and a group of holiday city vehicles travel throughout the City of Monrovia to spread holiday cheer.

December 14 – Canyon Park Staff and Volunteers gathered for the Canyon Park Volunteer Recognition dinner. Every year Staff recognizes selected members with Spirit and Volunteer of the year awards for those who showed great leadership and commendation for the 2022 year.

December 21 – Canyon Park Staff visited Plymouth Elementary 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class to concluded a STEM partnership program that started 5 week prior. Students presented on their finding of California native wildlife and impacts of residents of Monrovia coexisting together in the foothill community.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends the Community Services Commission move to receive and file CC-2, Canyon Park and Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for December 2022.
