CDBG Funding Source

THE PROCESS...

HUD

The funding process begins with the U.S.

Department of Housing and Urban
Development (HUD), which then carries
into the Community Development Block
Grant (CDBG) program. CDBG provides
annual grants on a formula basis to states,
cities, and counties principally for low- and
moderate-income persons.

LACDA

The Los Angeles County Development
Authority (LACDA), formerly known as the
Community Development Commission
(CDC), are the ones that administer CDBG
funding to over 45 non-entitlement
communities throughout the County, of
which Monrovia is a participating city.

MONROVIA

The City of Monrovia receives the new fiscal year's CDBG Annual Allocation by LACDA and presents those funds to City Council for approval. Once approved, implementation of funds to approved program(s) is initiated.

Non-Entitlement areas include units of general local government which do not receive CDBG funds directly from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development and are cities with a population of less than 50,000.




RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION

Program provides assistance to families from low to moderate income households through the CDBG Residential Rehabilitation Grant Program.

Staff works closely with Code Enforcement with referrals of those who cannot afford to pay for code corrections.


Eligibility intake phase opens annually for new applicants in July for two weeks. Preliminrary information to determine minimum eligibility is considered and reviewed in the order received.





FY23-24 CDBG Annual Allocation City Council Options

- APPROVE THE ESTIMATED FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT ALLOCATION, ACCEPT STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION TO USE IT FOR THE CONTINUANCE OF THE BASIC PROGRAMS THAT THE CITY COUNCIL HAS FUNDED IN PREVIOUS YEARS.
- REJECT THE ESTIMATED FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT ALLOCATION, DIRECT STAFF TO EXPLORE ALTERNATIVE FUNDING METHODS TO FUND FOR THESE EXISTING PROGRAMS. THIS OPTION WOULD RESULT IN THE CITY FORFEITING THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 CDBG FUNDS.
