Our history dates back to 2000 when the community was ready to rally behind the Monrovia Hillside Wilderness Preserve. In 2020, we realized now was the time to provide support again. We know the incredible value and amazing benefits we all receive from spending time in our parks, learning new skills or participating in a sport.
