

San Gabriel Basin Contamination

- First discovered in 1979
- U.S. Environmental Protection Agency designated several areas as Superfund sites under the Safe Drinking Water Act.
- State water regulators implemented basinwide testing program
- Local water districts/cities provided input



No existing agency had the statutory authority to handle the issues.

SGBWQA Act

1992

- 5-Member Board
 - Local agency responsible for groundwater cleanup
 - Non-regulatory
 - Plan and finance treatment projects
 - Groundwater Quality Management and Remediation Plan ("§406 Plan")
 - Coordinate with local, state and federal agencies
 - Sunset date

2000

- 7-Member Board
 - Two Producer members added.

2 city members:

- Valerie Munoz, City of La Puente (w/o pumping rights)
- Robert Gonzales, City of Azusa (w/ pumping rights)





3 municipal water district members:

- Ed Chavez, Upper San Gabriel Valley MWD
- Mark Paulson, San Gabriel Valley MWD
- Bob Kuhn, Three Valleys MWD







2 producer members:

- Lynda Noriega, California Domestic Water Company
- Mike Whitehead, San Gabriel Valley Water Company

2022

• AB2163 (Rubio) extended sunset date to July 1, 2050.

2023

- AB279 (Rubio) increases maximum <u>allowable</u> assessment from \$10/AF to \$20/AF of prescriptive pumping rights.
- Note: this does not raise the actual WQA assessment.

WQA State/Federal Funding

- WQA efforts have resulted in substantial funding for the basin:
 - Federal Funds (\$126M)
 - U.S. Bureau of Reclamation Title XVI
 - San Gabriel Basin Restoration Fund
 - EPA Cooperative Agreements

Federal Authorization: San Gabriel Basin Restoration Project, Appendix D, Division B, Title I, Section 110, Public Law 106-554, as amended

State Funds (\$60M)

- Propositions 13, 84, 1, 68
- State Water Board Cleanup and Abatement Account
- Department of Toxic Substances Control Program Funding
- Responsible Party Funds (\$700M)
 - Leveraged federal and state funds to achieve settlements with Responsible Parties
