Body Worn Cameras

- City Council approved purchase of 50 body-worn cameras in June 2022
- 5-year cost is \$578,051
- Worn by all field personnel
- All video is on a secure, cloud-based storage platform
- All data recorded is secured for evidentiary use but also for after-action review, training & development, and officer safety





In-Car Cameras

- In-car cameras record forward facing, rear, and in-car activity
- Provides situational awareness for responding officers
- Has license plate reader capabilities
- Records images of evidentiary nature
- Increases overall officer and passenger safety





Drones

- Police drones are used only for specific operations and emergency situations
- Operated by MPD trained personnel
- Provides real time information during specific situations
 - Friday Night Street Fair
 - Search for illegal encampments during wildfire season
- Enhances response efficiency to situations





Flock Cameras

- Reads and reports license plates to law enforcement
- Proven to reduce crime
- Can capture vehicles driving up to 100 MPH and up to 75 feet away
- Reads approximately 3.5 million license plates each month
- Has aided in the clearance and solving of countless crimes within our city and adjoining jurisdictions:
 - Homicide
 - Grand Theft Auto
 - Armed Robbery
 - Assault with a Deadly Weapon
 - Grand Theft





Portable CCT Camera

- Records and stores video of a designated location
- Highly visible public safety equipment
- Provides deterrence to illegal activity
- Enhances MPD's proactive approach to community concerns
- Has the ability to play timed public safety messages and give alerts to dispatch
- Crimes:
 - Battery
 - Vandalism
 - Trespassing
 - Disturbing the Peace
 - Theft



FUTURE DEPARTMENTAL NEEDS



DISPATCH CENTER

- The department is currently in the application phase for federal funding of updated dispatch consoles that will enable seamless communication interoperability



CITYWIDE STATIONARY CCTV

- Department is currently reviewing several vendor options aimed at replacing an outdated system throughout the city
