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Hi Brenda,

Following up from our call today re: ME2024-0005.

The description and diagram don't indicate how far to the West the new wall/fence will extend. As the existing fence extends to the property line to the West, I will assume that the new wall/fence will as well.

An attempt was made a few years ago to stabilize the Western end of the existing fence. A wooden pole with cement footing was installed in the drainage gutter that exists between 461 Granite and 468 N Canyon. This pole and cement footing were not part of the original fence (i.e., this is not a replacement for support elements of the original fence). The new wall/fence installation should:

- Remove the pole and cement footing that was added to repair the fence from the drainage gutter.
- Ensure the new wall/fence does not interfere with the existing drainage gutter.
