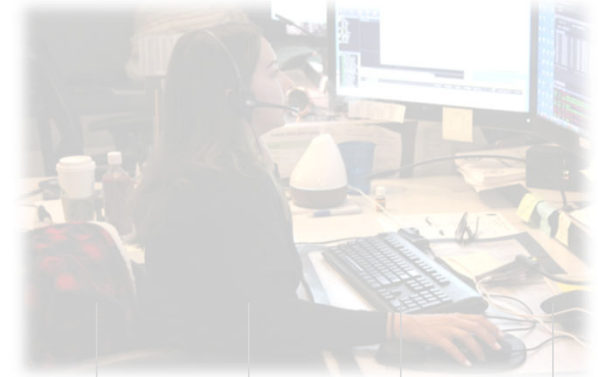
Calls for Service





Calls for Service

By Priority

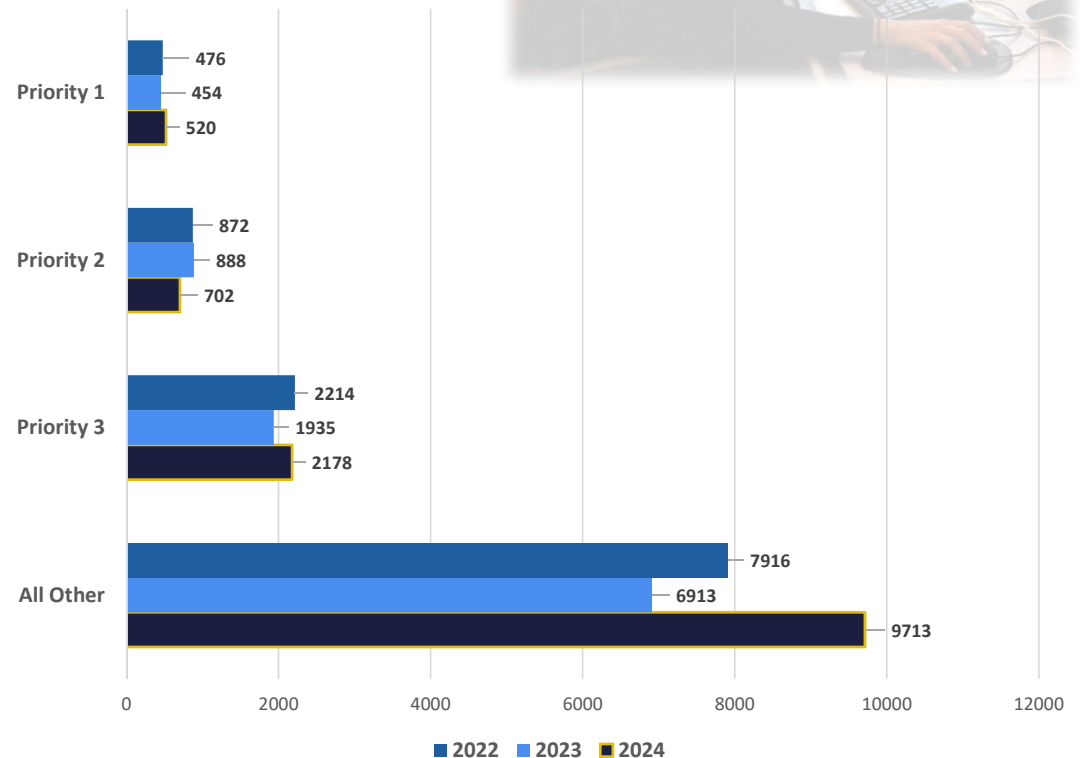


Priority 1: Calls where life is being threatened and requires officers to respond code 3 (lights and sirens). For example: medical assists, injury traffic collisions, robbery in progress, domestic violence in progress, etc.

Priority 2: Urgent calls that do not require officers to respond code 3. Such as shots heard, forgery in progress, 911 hang-ups, etc.

Priority 3: High-priority calls that are not in progress, do not require a code 3 response, at least 15 minutes cold, and life is not threatened. Such as Vandalism in progress, neighbor disputes, grand theft auto, etc.

All Other: Lower priority calls that do not require an urgent response, cold calls and non-urgent calls that may just require a notation in our software. Such as fireworks, drug activity, illegal dumping, found property, etc.





Calls for Service

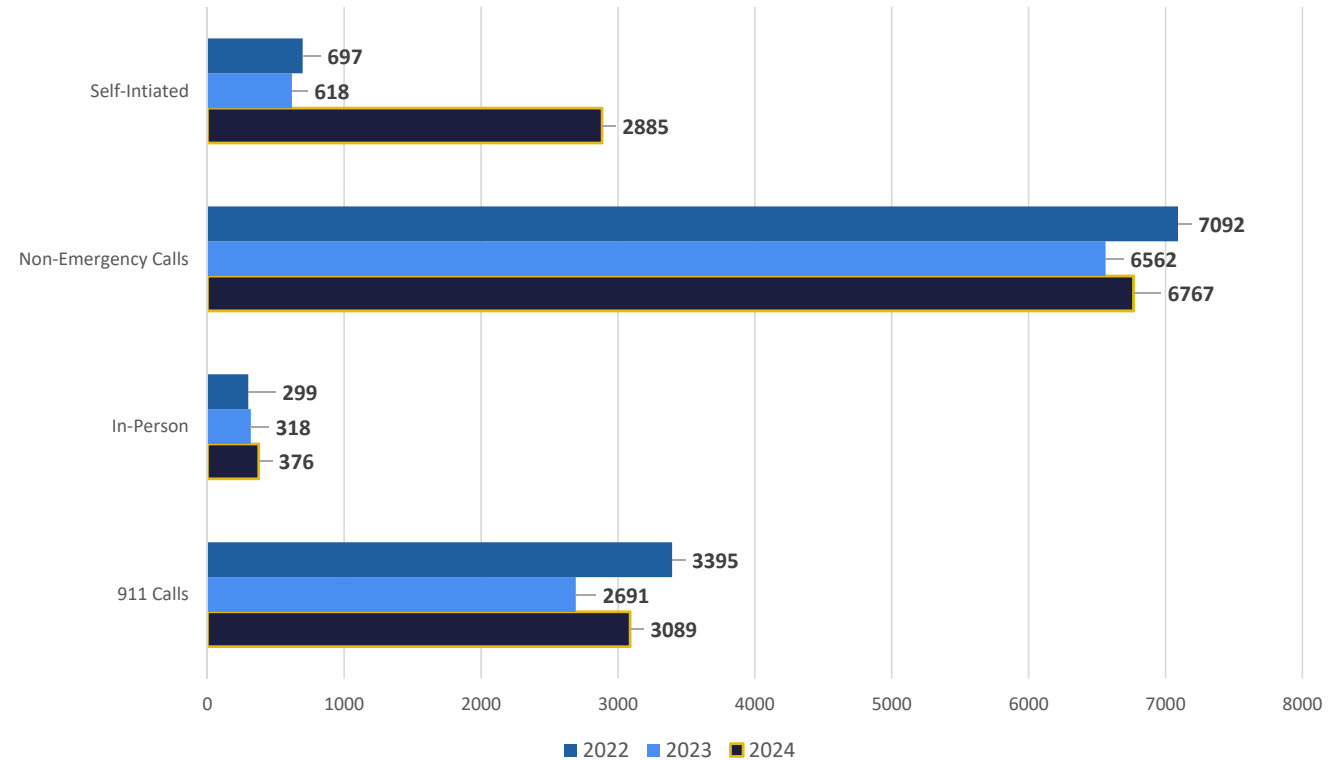
Types of Calls

Self-Initiated: Calls initiated by the officer.

Non-Emergency Calls: Calls received via the Police Department's non-emergency number.

In-Person: Calls related to, theft, fraud, burglary, found property, etc.

911 Calls: Calls received in the 911 dispatch center. Calls related to disturbing the peace, assault, battery, weapons offense, etc.





National Incident Based Reporting System

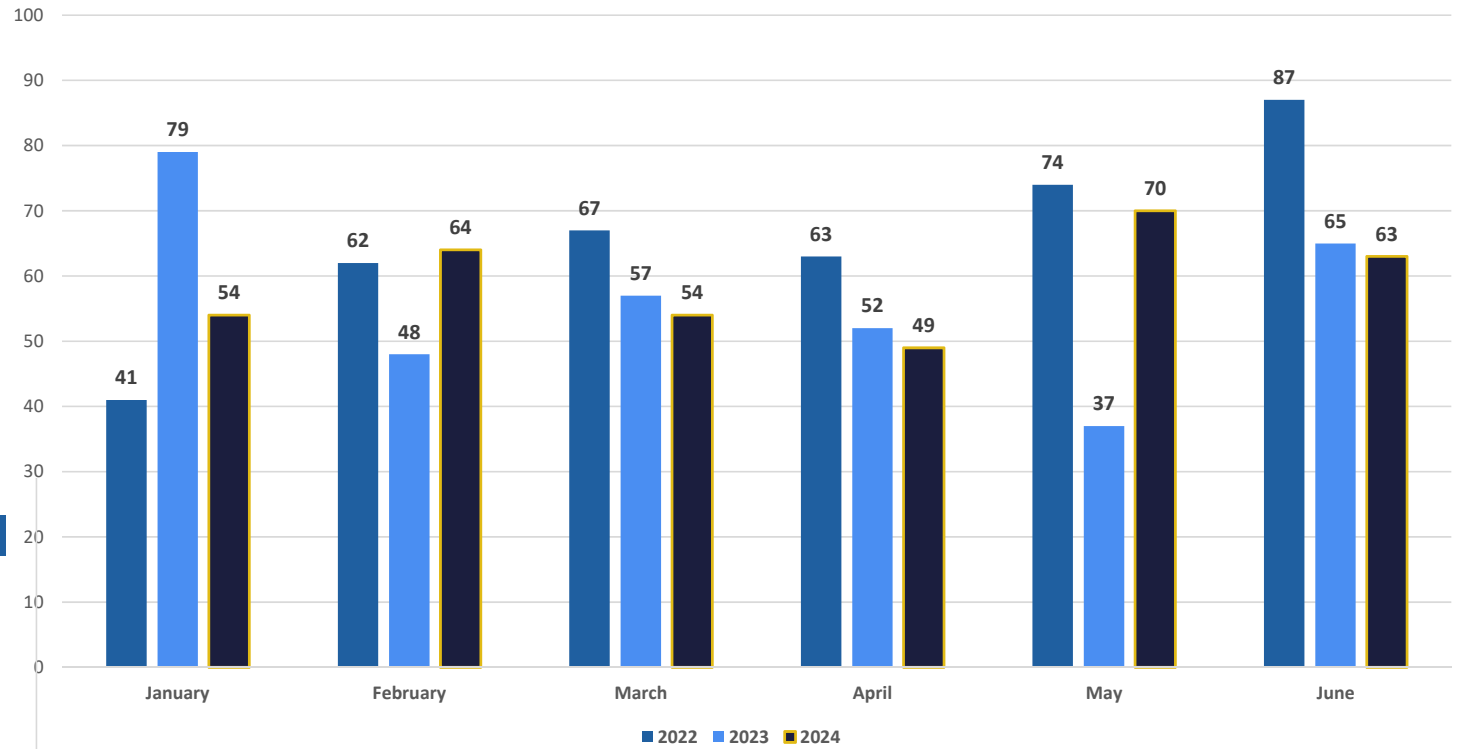
The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) was implemented on January 1, 2021 to improve the overall quality of crime data collected by law enforcement. Incident-based data is information about victims, offenders, times, and locations for one or more offenses in the occurrence.



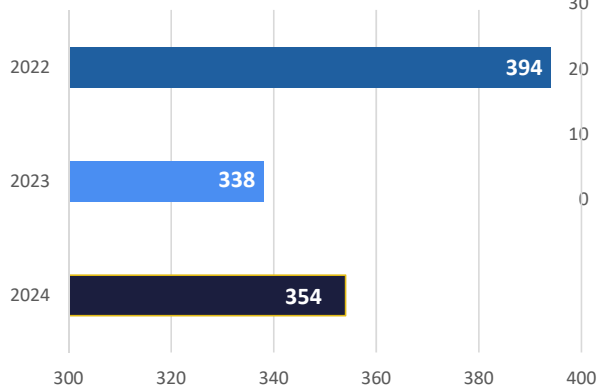


Arrests

Arrests: Monthly Comparison

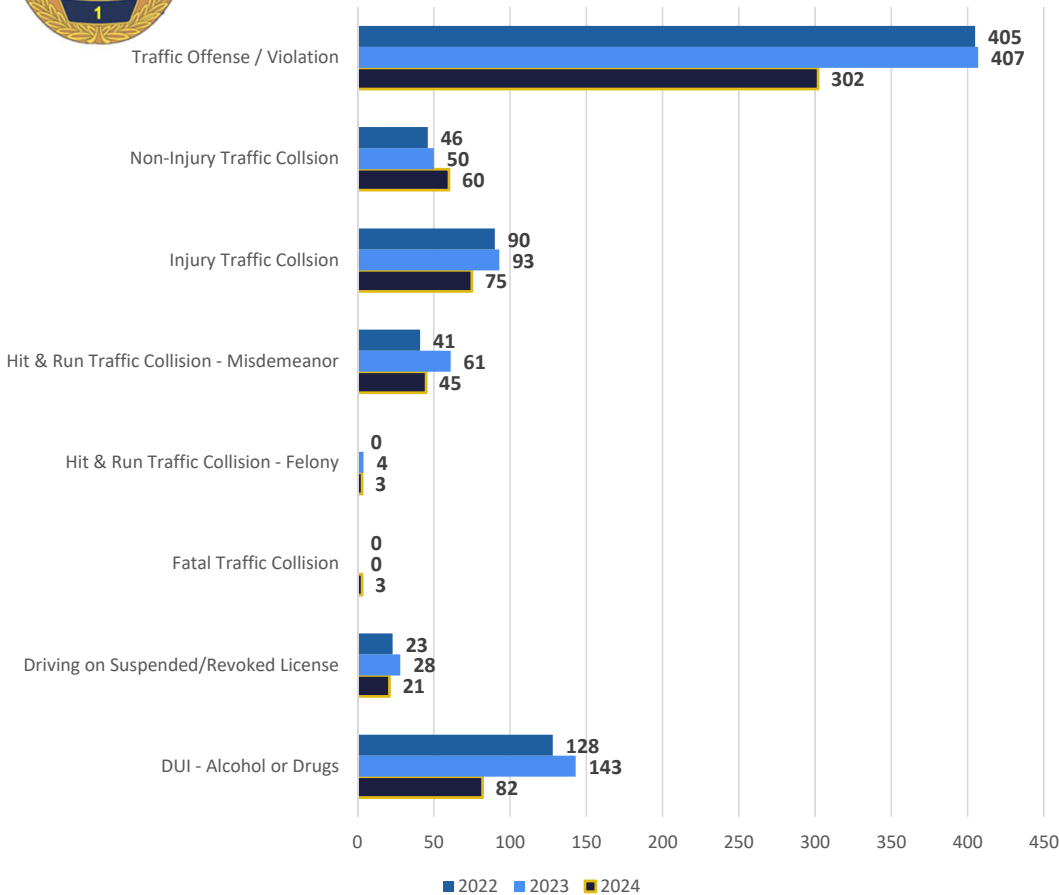


Arrests: Annual Comparison





Traffic Report



Traffic Offense/Violation: A vehicle or traffic code related offense.

Non-Injury Traffic Collision: Traffic collision where the parties involved did not report injuries.

Injury Traffic Collision: Traffic collision where the parties involved reported injuries.

Hit & Run Traffic Collision - Misdemeanor: A traffic collision where one of the parties involved fled the scene.

Hit & Run Traffic Collision - Felony: A traffic collision where one of the parties involved fled the scene.

Fatal Traffic Collision: A traffic collision where a party involved was fatally injured.

Driving on Suspended/Revoked License: A traffic stop where the driver was driving with a suspended or revoked license.

DUI – Alcohol or Drugs: Where the driver is found to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.



Investigations

Felony Cases

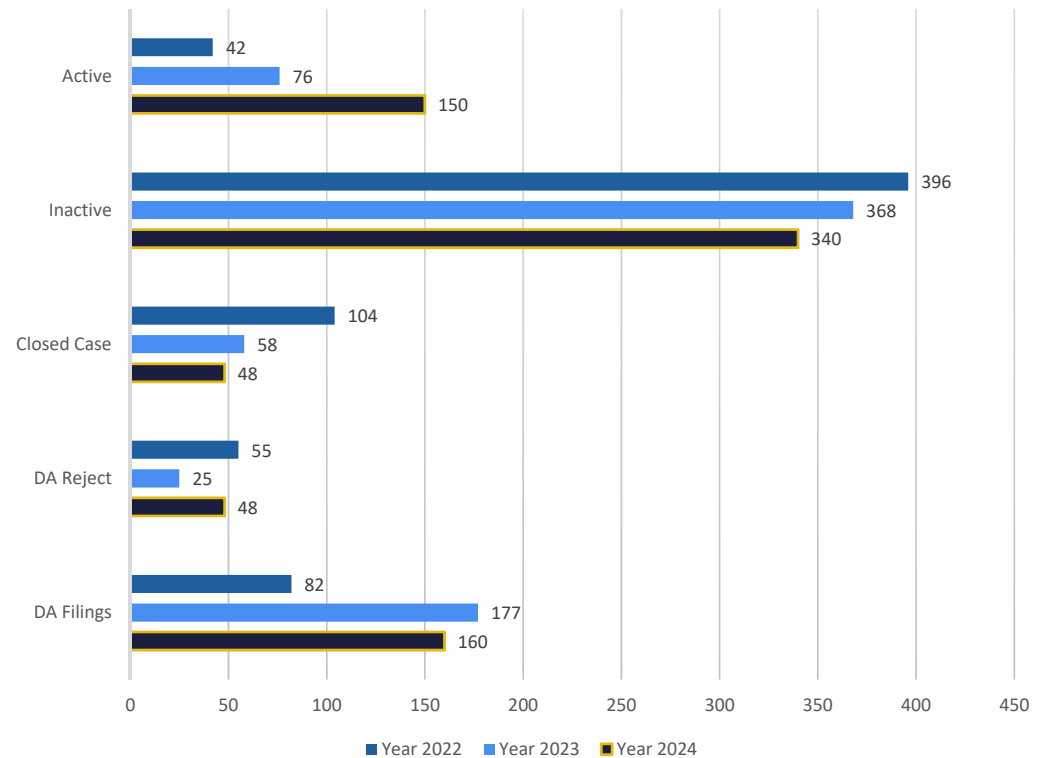
Active: A case that is open and being worked on.

Inactive: A case where all leads have been exhausted and there are no workable leads.

Closed: A case is closed when it has been forwarded to another agency, the statute of limitation has ran, determined to be a civil matter, citation diversion, etc.

DA Reject: A case that is rejected by the District Attorney's Office.

DA Filings: A case that has been filed with the District Attorney's Office.





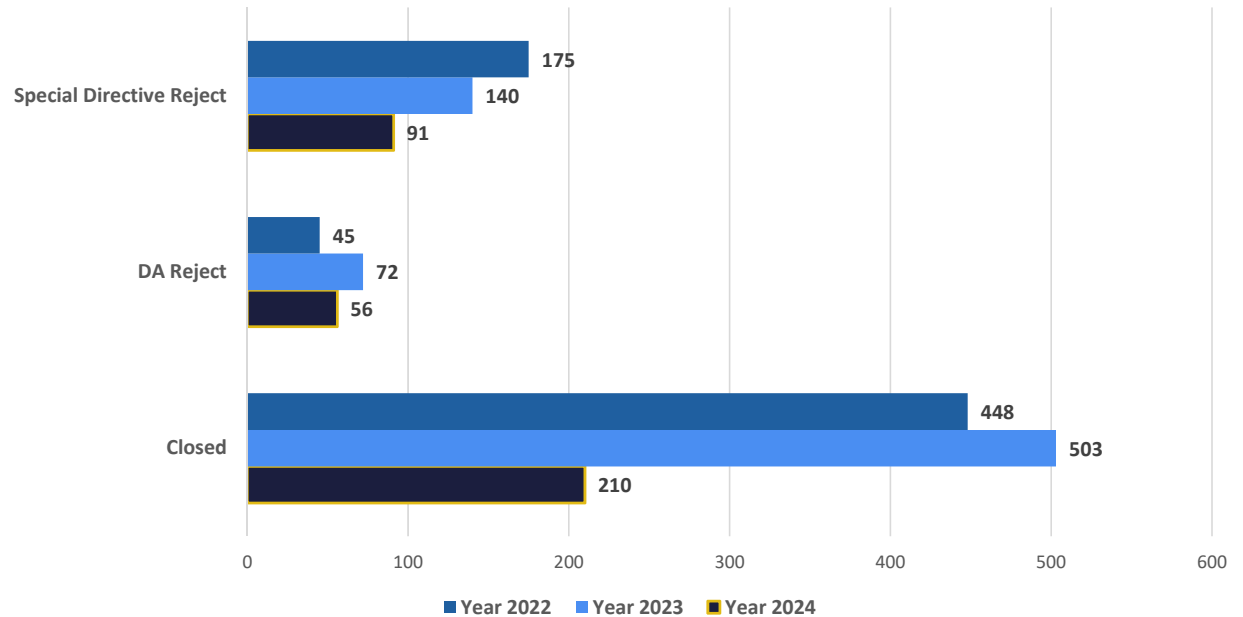
Investigations

Misdemeanor Cases

Special Directive Reject: A case that has been rejected because of directives established by the District Attorney.

DA Reject: A case that is rejected by the District Attorney's Office.

Closed: A case is closed has been filed by the DAs office or the City Attorneys office.
