A. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL

Motion to approve Minutes of the October 20, 2016, meeting.

C. FOLLOW-UP ITEMS

1. Req. #2015-188: Gold Line – Mayflower Ave and Central Ave Area

1. Central between Shamrock and Mountain

Preliminary plans were discussed at the December 17, 2015, meeting. The Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. Study was analyzed under Existing (Year 2015) Conditions and Existing with Proposed Street Improvements (Year 2015) Conditions; the intersection will operate at LOS B during both the morning and afternoon peak hours under both scenarios.

2. Mayflower and Huntington

Preliminary plans were discussed at the December 17, 2015, meeting. Re-adjustment of lane lines. Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. to present final plans. Committee to review signal timing.

2. Req. #2015-198: Duarte Rd West at Shamrock Ave to California Ave – Rear End Collisions

Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. to provide follow-up on Task Order for striping plan.

3. Req. #2016-026: North and South Mayflower Ave from Huntington Dr – Safety

Resident requesting to refresh street striping on north and south Mayflower from Huntington and/or to add raised pavement markers. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2015-188.*

4. **Req. #2016-040: 510 N Alta Vista Ave – Safety / Speeding**
Resident requesting safety mirrors on N Alta Vista (southbound traffic) for blind spots and speed cushions (northbound traffic) for speeding; no posted speed limit. Work Order placed to refresh the centerline striping and installation of 15 mph signage.
5. **Req. #2016-042 Wild Rose Bridge – Traffic (signage)**
Police Department requesting NO TRUCKS OVER 3 TONS signage on the Wild Rose bridge, for eastbound traffic, from Mountain onto the bridge and entering the City from Bradbury.
6. **Req. #2016-044: Mountain Ave and Lemon Ave – Safety / Traffic (signage)**
Resident requesting left-hand turn arrows, for north and southbound traffic, at Mountain and Lemon as on-coming traffic is not clearly visible. Task Order placed with Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines and turns. Design plans to be presented at the January 19, 2017, Traffic Safety Committee meeting. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014 and Req. #2016-047.*
7. **Req. #2016-045: 1953 S Peck Rd – Traffic / NO PARKING (red curb)**
Resident requesting full length red curb in front of his residence (north side of the driveway) due to line-of-site safety of on-coming traffic and to prevent residents from parking and blocking right-of-way for Burrtec to pick up the waste receptacles and the Postmaster from delivering the mail.
8. **Req. #2016-046: California Ave and Palm Ave – Safety (signage)**
Resident requesting a three-way Stop controlled T-intersection at California (north and southbound traffic) and Palm. Current one-way Stop T-intersection at Palm (eastbound traffic) and California.
9. **Req. #2016-047: Mountain Ave and Lemon Ave – Safety / Traffic (signage)**
Resident requesting left-hand turn arrows, for north and southbound traffic, at Mountain and Lemon as on-coming traffic is not clearly visible. Task Order placed with Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines and turns. Design plans to be presented at the January 19, 2017, Traffic Safety Committee meeting. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014 and Req. #2016-044.*
10. **Req. #2016-048: Mayflower Ave and Colorado Blvd – Safety / Traffic (signal)**
Resident requesting a traffic-light signal at the intersection of Mayflower and Colorado and to increase Police presence. Work Order placed to update current Stop signage. The Police Department will provide additional patrol to monitor traffic violators.
11. **Req. #2016-049: Primrose Ave and Huntington Dr – Safety / Traffic (signal)**
Resident requesting a traffic-light signal at the intersection of Primrose and Huntington.
12. **Req. #2016-050: 100 block of Spanner St – Speeding / Traffic (signage)**
Resident requesting truck weight limit and route signage. Increased truck traffic and speeding due to the operation of the Gold Line at the Myrtle and Duarte intersection. The Police Department will provide additional patrol to monitor truck route violators.
13. **Req. #2016-051: 1300 block of Sherman Ave – Permit Parking Only (overnight)**
Resident requesting Permit Parking Only. Petition received on Tuesday, September 6, 2016. Letter notifying residents of proposed Permit Parking Only (overnight), with a provided 30 day response timeline, to be mailed on Tuesday, November 15, 2016. Work Order placed for signage installation. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2015-186 – Closed.*

14. Req. #2016-052: Myrtle Ave and Duarte Rd – Safety / Traffic (signage)

Resident requesting a NO TURN ON RED sign at the Myrtle and Duarte (Gold Line) intersection for southbound Myrtle traffic.

15. Req. #2016-054: 200 block of W Evergreen Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting data box speed study and Police Department decoy vehicle placement. Posted speed limit is 35 mph on the one-way block east of Magnolia. Traffic Officer Mead patrolled the area on Thursday, October 6, 2016, during the early morning rush hour traffic hours. A total of 105 vehicles were tracked with one speeding citation issued. A decoy vehicle was placed on Tuesday, October 11, 2016. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study.

16. Req. #2016-055: 100 block of E Cypress Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting speed cushions and data box speed study. Posted speed limit is 25 mph. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study from Thursday, October 6, 2016, through Thursday, October 20, 2016. The data box statistics indicate that 5,199 vehicles were tracked with the average speed of 28 mph driven. Letter mailed on Thursday, November 10, 2016.

17. Req. #2016-056: Shadow Ln and Shady Oaks Dr – Safety / Traffic (signage)

Resident requesting YEILD TO CROSS TRAFFIC signage. On Tuesday, September 20, 2016, City Council approved the installation of a Stop sign on Shadow Ln at the Shady Oaks intersection. Stop sign installed on Thursday, September 22, 2016. The Police Department was provided a 30-day notice.

18. Req. #2016-057: 140 N Mountain Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting speed cushions. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study from Thursday, June 16, through Wednesday, July 6, 2016. The data box statistics indicate that 31,181 vehicles were tracked. The 85th percentile of speed driven is 28 mph with the overall average speed of 23.5 mph driven. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Letter mailed on Monday, July 18, 2016, notifying the resident of the data box statistics. The highest speed tracked was 53 mph. Letter mailed on Thursday, November 10, 2016, of the highest speed tracked. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-010 – Closed.*

19. Req. #2016-058: 159 Grand Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting additional speed cushions on Grand from Greystone to Foothill. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study from Tuesday, May 24, through Tuesday, June 7, 2016. The data box statistics indicate that 8,932 vehicles were tracked. The 85th percentile of speed driven is 31.9 mph with the overall average speed of 28 mph driven. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-015 – Closed.*

D. AGENDA ITEMS

1. Req. #2016-059: N Madison Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting NOW ENTERING A RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD – PLEASE SLOW DOWN signage. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Current speed cushions at the southern end of the street towards Foothill.

2. Req. #2016-060: Huntington Dr – Signage (commercial street sweeping)

Install street sweeping signage (2 a.m. – 6 p.m.) on Huntington from the east City limits to the west City limits.

3. Req. #2016-061: 114 ½ Los Angeles Ave (alleyway) – Speeding / Safety / Traffic

Resident requesting one-way alley (between Los Angeles and Fig) and posted neighborhood safety signage; i.e., neighborhood watch, 25 mph speed limit, no loitering and children present. Excessive speeding during rush hour traffic.

4. Req. #2016-062: Oakdale Ave – Speeding

Resident requesting to install speed cushions on Oakdale between Mountain and Shamrock. Cross-gutter dip located midblock from Mountain to Shamrock.

5. Req. #2016-063: Scenic Ave and Canyon Blvd – Signage

Review intersection Stop signage. Currently two-way east / west Stop.

6. Req. #2016-064: 1810 S Shamrock Ave – Traffic / NO PARKING (red curb)

Business requesting red curb at both driveway entrances / exits. Large work trucks and 18 wheelers have a difficult time entering and exiting as vehicles are parked up to the driveway entrance / exit.
