TITLE: Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrol Update for August 1-31, 2015

OBJECTIVE: The purpose of this report is to provide the Community Services Commission with a monthly update on Hillside Wilderness Preserve Patrols.

BACKGROUND: The following information is an overview of the daily patrols of the Hillside Wilderness Preserve for August 2015. Rangers patrol four access points which include Sleepy Hollow, Ridgeside, Cloverleaf and Highland. A minimum of 2 patrols per day are conducted at each access point.

Sleepy Hollow – The Sleepy Hollow access point is located off of Norumbega Drive and the paper street Traci Lane. The access point leads to an out-and-back trail primarily used by the adjacent neighborhoods for its vista point views looking to the south. There were no Police, Animal Control, or Fire calls for service this month.

Ridgeside – The Ridgeside access point is located off of Ridgeside Drive, ¼ mile north of Briarcliff Drive. The trail is approximately 1 mile in length, and has three vista points. This access point is the entrance leading to the Lower Clamshell Motorway, and the loop where the Braunton's Milk Vetch is present. There were no Police, Animal Control, or Fire calls for service this month.

Cloverleaf – The Cloverleaf access point is located at the end Cloverleaf Drive. This access point follows the Clamshell Motorway to Ridgeside and is also the location of Station 103, and the entry road to the private in holders. There were no Police, Animal Control, or Fire calls for service this month.

Highland – The Highland access point is located at the end of Highland Place. The trail is ½ mile in length and out-and-back to the water tower. There were no Police, Animal Control, or Fire calls for service this month.

Monthly Patrol Log – The following information is an overview of data extrapolated from the daily patrol logs for August 2015 and is broken down into each week of the month.

Please note: staff separated patrols and activities as a way to better identify usage. There were fewer patrols this year than last which is attributed to one HWP staff member focusing on land management, and the other staff on patrols. This does not mean that there was a reduced presence in the Hillside Wilderness Preserve.
