TITLE: Infrastructure Manager/Deputy Director of Public Works Report

OBJECTIVE: The purpose of this report is to provide the Community Services Commission with a brief update on projects, and maintenance programs currently being worked on by the Public Works Department.

No Smoking Signs - were installed at the exterior doors and opening windows at City facilities.

Canyon Park

- Work continues on the sewer/septic tank system.
- Several repairs made at the restrooms.

Community Center

- Repaired lighting in several rooms.
- The kitchen Fire system was tested and passed.

Grand Avenue Park

 The Redwood trees at the Grand Avenue entrance to the Park have been removed, and will be replaced with an Oak tree.

Julian Fisher Park

- Public works staff has applied for a Los Angeles County grant for replacement of the basketball courts and other improvements at the park.
- Remove dead Oak tree after approval (on removal schedule).

Library and Park

- The fountain on the Northwest corner of Myrtle and Lime Avenues was damaged by a vehicle. The Monrovia Historical Preservation Group completed the reconstruction of the roof structure, and is scheduling the installation of the replacement tiles.
- Repairs were made to the park irrigation system.
- Repairs were made on the Play Equipment.
- · Repaired lighting in the Library.

CC-2

Lucinda Garcia Park (previously known as Olive Avenue Park)

- Public Works staff applied for a Los Angeles County Grant to replace the playground equipment and make several other improvements.
- Graffiti was removed.
- Repairs made to the play equipment.

Recreation Park

- Graffiti at the Skate Park, restrooms, museum and Boys and Girls Club.
- Repairs were done in the KGEM restrooms.
- Repairs were made to the irrigation systems.
- The exterior building lights were repaired at the Mary Wilcox Youth Center.

Rotary Park

• The existing park sign was pressure washed.
