**A. MINUTES FOR APPROVAL**

Motion to approve Minutes of the May 18, 2017, meeting. June 15, 2017, meeting canceled.

**C. FOLLOW-UP ITEMS**

**1. Req. #2015-188: Gold Line – Mayflower Ave and Central Ave Area**

**2. Mayflower Ave and Huntington Dr**

Preliminary plans were discussed at the December 17, 2015, meeting. Re-adjustment of lane lines. Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. to present final plans. Committee to review signal timing.

**2. Req. #2016-026: North and South Mayflower Ave from Huntington Dr – Safety**

Resident requesting to refresh street striping on north and south Mayflower from Huntington and/or to add raised pavement markers. Intersection is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2015-188.*

**3. Req. #2016-044: Mountain Ave and Lemon Ave – Safety / Traffic (signage)**

Resident requesting left-hand turn arrows, for north and southbound traffic, at Mountain and Lemon as on-coming traffic is not clearly visible. Task Order placed with Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines and turns. Design plans to be presented for approval. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014, Req. #2016-047, and Req. #2017-014.*

**4. Req. #2016-047: Mountain Ave and Lemon Ave – Safety / Traffic (signage)**

Resident requesting left-hand turn arrows, for north and southbound traffic, at Mountain and Lemon as on-coming traffic is not clearly visible. Task Order placed with Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc. for the re-adjustment of lane lines and turns. Design

plans to be presented for approval. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014, Req. #2016-044, and Req. #2017-014.*

**5. Req. #2016-065: California Ave and Lemon Ave – Safety (signage)**

Resident requesting a four-way Stop controlled intersection on California at Lemon. Current two-way Stop controlled intersection on Lemon (east / west traffic). The Police Department records indicate that seven collisions have occurred as of January 2016. Of the seven collisions, six were non-injury and one was a hit and run investigation. There were two Police Reports taken of the seven incidents. Cross Traffic Does Not Stop (east / west traffic) signage installed, 25 linear feet of red curbing installed on the eastside of California north and south of Lemon, along with the refreshing the intersection striping. Brush clearance completed on the southwest corner. Letter to be sent to the resident to provide a traffic calming update with a six month evaluation period.

**6. Req. #2017-001: Bradbury Rd speed cushions – Traffic**

Resident requesting the removal of the Bradbury speed cushions installed in December 2015 in response to the letter received as to the installation.

**7. Req. #2017-002: 438 E Duarte Rd – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**

Resident requesting a data box speed study, center island installation, and additional Police presence to monitor traffic violators. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study on Tuesday, April 4, through Saturday, April 8, 2017. The data box statistics indicated that 19,596 vehicles were tracked. The overall speed driven was 38 mph. The highest speed tracked, of three vehicles between midnight and 12:30 a.m., was 60 mph during the study. It is unknown if these vehicles were first responders. The posted speed limit is 40 mph. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the data box speed study statistics.

**8. Req. #2017-005: 620 Linwood Ave – Traffic / NO PARKING (red curb)**

Resident requesting red curb at driveway apron. Trash receptacles are being moved onto the lawn to allow for street parking. Staff conducted a site evaluation. There is very limited residential parking. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the site evaluation results and upcoming street renewal. *Closed.*

**9. Req. #2017-008: Parkrose Ave at Bradoaks Elementary School – Traffic**

Resident requesting additional Police patrol to monitor traffic violators; NO U-TURN and parking in stripped red curb zone during school drop-off and pick-up hours. Police Department to provide visual presence and monitor traffic. Area is currently being evaluated by Gibson Transportation Consulting, Inc.

**10. Req. #2017-010: N Canyon Blvd (north of Foothill) – Speeding**

Resident requesting speed cushions on N Canyon, north of Foothill, due to speeding. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study on Tuesday, March 7, through Tuesday, March 14, 2017. The data box statistics indicated that 19,161 vehicles were tracked. The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile of speed tracked was 34 mph with the overall speed of 29.3 mph driven. The highest speed tracked, of one vehicle, was 71 mph during the study. It is unknown if this vehicle was a first responder. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the data box speed study statistics. *Closed.*

**11. Req. #2017-012: Almond Ave – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**

Resident requesting data box speed study. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study.

- 12. Req. #2017-013: Bradoaks Ave and Greystone Ave – Safety / Traffic**  
Resident requesting speed cushions to prevent traffic from failing to stop and rolling through the intersection. Work Order placed to refresh striping and replace Stop signage.
- 13. Req. #2017-014: Mountain Ave (north of Lemon) – Safety / Traffic / No Parking**  
Resident requesting red curbing on the east side of Mountain, north of Lemon, prior to the northbound traffic lanes merging to the left. Temporary NO PARKING to be posted. Letter to be sent notifying the residents of the temporary NO PARKING and potential red curbing. *Cross-referenced with Req. #2016-014, Req. #2016-044, and Req. #2016-47.*
- 14. Req. #2017-015: 714 N Norumbega Dr – Speeding**  
Resident requesting a data box speed study and speed cushions on N Norumbega due to speeding. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study.
- 15. Req. #2017-016: Mayflower and Evergreen / Diamond – Safety / Crosswalks / Sidewalks**  
Resident requesting 4-way crosswalks and wrap-around sidewalks, currently blocked by an Edison power pole, and to allow for pedestrian traffic.
- 16. Req. #2017-017: Valley View and Mountain Avenues / Greystone and Valle Vista Avenues – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**  
Resident requesting Police patrol and traffic calming for the Valley View and Mountain Aves / Greystone and Valle Vista Aves intersections due to traffic violators not adhering to the four-way Stop controlled intersections. The Police Department to provide additional patrol. *Closed.*
- 17. Req. #2017-018: Carmelita Circle and Sierra Terrace – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**  
Resident requesting traffic calming, a data box speed study and speed cushions on Sierra Terrace due to speeding. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study on Tuesday, May 23, through Thursday, June 6, 2017. The data box statistics indicated that 3,719 vehicles were tracked with the overall speed of 27 mph driven. The highest speed tracked, of one vehicle at 10:50 a.m., was 73 mph during the study. It is unknown if this vehicle was a first responder. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the data box speed study statistics.
- 18. Req. #2017-019: Shady Oaks Drive and N Canyon Boulevard – Safety / Signage**  
Resident requesting three-way Stop controlled T-intersection at Shady Oaks and Canyon. Current one-way Stop controlled intersection on Shady Oaks. Work Order placed for northeast corner brush clearance.
- 19. Req. #2017-020: 200 block of Mountain Ave – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**  
Resident requesting traffic calming, a data box speed study, and speed cushions on the 200 block of Mountain due to speeding. The Police Department conducted a data box speed study from Thursday, June 16, through Wednesday, July 6, 2016. The data box statistics indicate that 31,181 vehicles were tracked. The 85th percentile of speed driven is 28 mph with the overall average speed of 23.5 mph driven. The highest speed tracked was 53 mph. It is unknown if this vehicle was a first responder. The posted speed limit is 25 mph. Staff to conduct a site evaluation for traffic calming improvements. The Police Department conducted an updated speed study between June 6 and June 12, 2017. During that time, 11,688 vehicles were tracked with an average speed of 24 mph. The highest speed tracked was 44 mph on June 8. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of the data box speed study statistics.
- 20. Req. #2017-022: 120 West Cypress Ave – Speeding / Safety / Traffic**

Resident requesting traffic calming and a data box speed study on W Cypress due to speeding. Police Department to conduct a data box speed study.

**21. Req. #2017-023: 501 King St – Blue ADA Curb**

Resident requesting a blue ADA curb in front of residence. Resident has a driveway with on-site parking. Letter to be sent notifying the resident of declined request. *Closed.*

**22. Req. #2017-024: 140 North Heliotrope Ave – Blue ADA Curb**

Resident requesting a blue ADA curb in front of residence. Staff to conduct a second on-site evaluation.

**1. Req. #2017-025: 100 East Evergreen Ave alleyway – Traffic**

Resident requesting traffic calming in the alleyway due to excessive traffic during peak hours due to the Gold Line intersections.

**2. Req. #2017-026: Alta Vista and Chestnut Ave – Safety / Signage**

Resident requesting a 4-way Stop controlled intersection; currently a 2-way intersection.

**3. Req. #2017-027: Mountain Ave and Royal Oaks intersection – Safety / Crosswalk**

Resident requesting redesign of the center island impeding the east / west intersection crosswalk for ADA safety and regulations.
